CAN'T SELL GASOLINE ON SABBATH DAY HERE

Police Justice Holds That Motorists Must Get Supplies During Week.

ONE DEALER IS FINED \$5

F. H. Norvell Notes Appeal When His Counsel Fails to Convince Cadi That Sale on Sunday Is Labor of Necessity.

This Sunday sale of gasoline and automobile tires by a garage proprietor to his patrons is not a necessity, according to a decision made by Police Justice Cutchfield yesterday.

Justice Cutchfield continued until July 12 the case against H. E. Chelf, druggist, and Early Powell, his clerk, who were charged with selling soft drinks on the Sabbath.

Another case continued was that against Marcellus Hicks, charged with employing chauffeurs to operate automobiles for hire on Sunday.

It was decided, however, that while the operation of a public garage on Sunday is not necessary, the manufacture of gas and the maintenance of tires under brick kilns is a work of necessity, and the court dismissed the cases against Henrico County Gas Company and the Wellington Brick Company.


