He says, in part: "While I regret that our party, consisting of Dr. Frank P. Thompson, Dr. Edwin Brooke and myself, were not successful in finding any trace of Dr. Tanquary, I did bring back with me to civilization the most remarkable motion pictures ever secured in the Arctic regions."

Dr. Ruskin's trip took them up through the Bering Sea to the most northern point in Alaska, Point Barrow. Here they fitted out three separate dog expeditions with six Eskimos to each party. Each party took a different direction and searched the ice for ninety days. He saw, of his walrus pictures: "Caution was necessary, for I knew the temper of the walrus when he expected to be attacked by man. Before you could count twenty-five the whole herd dived from the ice, and in less time than it takes to relate, we found our little boat upset and all of us in the cold water. Although clothed in heavy furs, all but three managed to get hold of the upturned boat, but three poor fellows were either crushed by ice or the walrus. It took us the balance of the day to approach this immense herd, but I did secure the most wonderful motion pictures the world has ever witnessed of these immense brutes diving and fighting one another and trying to get us."

Train Hits Wagon Filled With Children

Eighteen Young People Have Narrow Escape at Glen Allen Grade Crossing.

Eighteen school children narrowly escaped death or serious injury Friday afternoon about 2 o'clock when southbound Richmond, Fredericksburg and Potomac train No. 15, due to arrive in Richmond at 2:40 o'clock, crashed into a wagon in which they were returning from school at a grade crossing near Glen Allen. Two horses hitched to the wagon were instantly killed, and the driver's arm was broken, but other occupants of the wagon escaped injury.

The train was running at high speed, having left Fredericksburg several minutes late. The driver of the wagon, from what could be gathered yesterday, did not hear the train's approach at the grade crossing and started across the tracks. The engine struck the two horses, instantly killing them and cutting the tongue of the wagon. The driver was thrown to the ground and his arm broken, but so quickly did the accident happen and with such force did the engine strike the horses that they were torn from the wagon without other damage being done.

The train was stopped for a few minutes, but later proceeded to Richmond when it was found that no one had been

seriously hurt. The driver of the wagon was treated by a Glen Allen physician, and was improving yesterday.
