

COMMITTEE COMPLETES LABOR ON WAR TAX BILL

After Six Weeks in Redrafting, It Is Reported to Senate by Chairman Simmons.

IT PROVIDES \$1,670,170,000

This Amount Less by \$130,000,000 Than Proposed by House—Measure Will Come Up for Action When Food Problem Is Disposed Of.

(By Associated Press.) WASHINGTON, July 3.—Predictions of a bitter fight in conference between the House and Senate over the war revenue bill unless drastic changes are made by the Senate in the draft its Finance Committee reported to-day were made to-night by Representative Rainey, ranking Democratic member of the House Ways and Means Committee.

Primarily, Mr. Rainey said, the total of the Senate draft, \$1,670,000,000, must be raised. The House, he believes, will insist on the measure carrying at least the \$1,800,000,000 originally proposed, on the ground that Congress has no right to mortgage the future to any greater extent than by the \$7,000,000,000 of war bonds already authorized.

Mr. Rainey declared the Senate measure was a rich man's bill, and that the House would stand pat on a demand that the burden be transferred from the shoulder of the poor.

"From the 'salty man's viewpoint,'" he said, "the Senate draft certainly is an excellent measure. It would lift income, automobile, 'stray' income and other taxes from the wealthy and settle the burden on tea, sugar, cocoa and other necessities used in every home. I cannot believe that there will not be changes made on the floor."

The Lenroot amendment, greatly increasing taxes on incomes above \$40,000, adopted by the House, but stricken out by the Senate committee, is almost certain to be restored, Mr. Rainey believes.

"Perhaps the most illogical proposal of all," he declared, "is the publishers' tax. Why should he pay an income, excess profits and a special tax too?"

Unsuccessful as the Senate draft is, the House leaders say it still can be made the subject of conference.

REDRAFT IS REPORTED BY FINANCE COMMITTEE Providing taxes for war purposes of \$1,670,170,000, about \$130,000,000 less than the House authorized, the war tax bill as revised by the Senate Finance Committee after six weeks' work was reported to-day to the Senate by Chairman Simmons. It will be taken up after the food control measure is passed.

Vastly increased income taxes and levies upon excess profits resulting from war times, liquors and tobacco form the bulk of the new taxation measure, the largest in the country's history.

Upon incomes the bill would impose \$32,700,000 in additional taxes, upon excess profits of corporations, partnerships and individuals, \$523,000,000; upon liquors, \$155,000,000, and tobacco, \$56,600,000.

After formal presentation of the revised bill, Chairman Simmons later will file a report detailing the committee's work of six weeks, by which it is believed the measure has been greatly improved without materially decreasing the House revenue yield.

No additional bonds will be authorized under the bill, as any deficit, it is believed, can be taken care of by Congress in ample time at next December's session, although the measure will fall short by many millions of meeting expenses of the war next year, estimated at \$2,328,000,000, not including new appropriations coming for the army and navy.

The revised bill which is scheduled for material amendment in the Senate and further changes in conference, eliminates many objections raised to the House measure by business interests. It also provides for changes in revenue raising, the latter including a new plan for direct payment of income taxes instead of "collection at the source." All so-called "special" taxes upon special industry embraced under the House levy of 5 per cent upon gross sales of many manufacturers were eliminated.

The committee also rejected the Senate general tariff increase, designed to raise \$200,000,000, and substituted consumption taxes upon coffee, tea, sugar and cocoa, estimated to yield \$86,000,000.

Reduction of income taxation to single persons with income over \$1,000 annually and married persons at \$2,000 and over, with incomes under \$5,000 subject to a new "normal" tax of 2 per cent, were House provisions unchanged. The committee reduced House rates on incomes over \$40,000, by decreasing the revenue return by \$66,000,000. It also struck out inheritance taxes designed to raise \$6,000,000, and retroactive taxes on 1916 incomes for a further reduction of \$108,000,000.

CONTAINS PROPOSED TAX ON PUBLISHERS' PROFITS After many changes, the final committee draft contains the proposed tax of 5 per cent upon profits of publishers in excess of \$4,000, estimated to raise \$7,500,000, and adds an increase of 1-4 cent a pound on second-class postage rates, estimated to yield \$3,000,000. Strenuous efforts are expected in the Senate for amendment of the impost upon publishers.
