South Carolina Organization Sends Out Letters to All Chapters in State.

HOLD PARADE AT COLUMBIA

Women of Fifth District Are Making House-to-house Canvass With Magnificent Results—Mrs. Seay Leads Baltimore Demonstration.

An interesting feature of the work of the woman's committee for the fourth Liberty loan in Columbia, S. C., is the fact that a series of four weekly letters are being sent out to the various Red Cross chapters in the State as part of a broad educational campaign to enlighten the people of the country about the government's war appropriations and expenditures to face and its needs for the future. These letters are sufficient in quantity for branches and auxiliaries and have been sent to chapters in the Southern Division.

Mrs. George J. Seay, chairman of the Fifth Federal Reserve District, and her chairmen and committees for the loan are especially interested in this co-operation of the Red Cross and the workers for the Liberty loan, as a means to showing the people in isolated districts for just what parts the money will be spent by the government with the bonds sold.

PARADE OF WOMEN HELD IN COLUMBIA YESTERDAY
A splendid parade was held in Columbia yesterday, and many volunteered the use of their motors to bring the convalescent soldiers from Camp Jackson to witness it. Some 300 of these soldiers were in Columbia for the parade. Mrs. E. S. Mueller is State chairman for Columbia and enthusiastic reports of the work have been sent in. The South Carolina Federation of Women's Clubs has organized to assist in the loan and the president issued a formal proclamation to all club women in the State to respond with a tremendous over subscription of the loan, as well as do their utmost in this patriotic work. "We have sent the boys over and we cannot fall them now," is the slogan for the women of South Carolina.

The State organizer for South Carolina and the county chairmen have covered many counties and townships in many places the foremen in the cotton fields stopped the men picking cotton and gave three cheers for the Liberty loan car, which was decorated with bells. Open-air meetings have been held in many small towns and villages, with picturesque groves and meadows for a background.
