Hear Mrs. M. L. Hargrove Fling Out Challenge in Approaching Campaign.

Movement a Gigantic Task

Mrs. Lee Britt, of Suffolk, and Miss Ruth Blanks, of Petersburg, Carry on Message—Musical Program Feature of Affair.

Like a trumpet call to arms was the challenge flung by Mrs. M. L. Hargrove, director of the women's department of "The Centenary," whose address thrilled a great audience of Methodist women at a luncheon in the gymnasium of the Blues' Armory yesterday.

Covers were laid for 450 guests. Mrs. W. D. Newell, district secretary, presided and introduced the speakers.

Miss Florence Kinney, of the Sunday party, caught up Mrs. Hargrove's challenge and expressed faith in the success of the movement and a prophecy of what the future held for a united Northern and Southern Methodism.

Leaders of Methodism, declared Mrs. Hargrove, had caught the splendor of the vision of the evangelization of the world, and in this vision of the world need the gigantic task of which it was a province had also been made clear to them.

She referred to the Centenary movement as a world task, which imposed a world task, and that God had laid His hand upon Methodism in America, and in a glimpse of the glory of the vision of world evangelization He had spoken to Methodists and said, "Go forth and conquer."
