LABOR HAS FULL SWING AT METHODIST CENTENARY

Prominent Leaders Given Floor for Addresses Held in Columbus Coliseum.

(By Associated Press.) COLUMBUS, OHIO, June 28.—Labor had full swing at the Methodist centenary exposition today. The feature of the program was a mass-meeting at the Coliseum at 2 o'clock this afternoon at which addresses were delivered by prominent labor leaders, among them being Margaret Bonfield, English labor leader; John H. Walker, former president of the Illinois Federation of Labor; and Glen E. Plum, counsel for the railway Brotherhoods. Preceding

the Coliseum meeting a parade was given on the exposition grounds. The exposition, in the opinion of centenary officials, surpasses all expectations in point of attendance and attractions. Yesterday's attendance, when former President William Howard Taft was a speaker, was estimated at more than 75,000. Next week William Jennings Bryan and William G. McAdoo are scheduled to deliver addresses.

Tomorrow will be Bible day at the centenary. Only religious services will be held, the exposition buildings being closed on Sunday.

Will Enlarge Warehouse. DANVILLE, Va., June 28.—Material alterations are being made to the Planters Tobacco Warehouse, which when completed, will be the second largest auction floor in Danville. Stalls are being built in a basement, which

is now being excavated, and the warehouse is being joined with a disused tobacco factory, giving room for 600 more piles of tobacco. The cost of the operation is \$10,000.

TWO MEN SCALDED

Henry Mansfield and William O. Haase Burned When Hotel Boiler Bursts.

Henry Mansfield, of 1301 North Twenty-eighth Street, and William O. Haase, of 808 East Clay Street, were both badly burned yesterday, when a boiler in a downtown hotel, where they were employed, burst. A valve trouble was said to have caused the accident. Both were scalded around the head, chest and knees, according to reports from the hospitals, where they were

taken. Mansfield was taken to the Virginia Hospital in a private automobile, while Haase was taken to the Memorial Hospital in an ambulance. The condition of neither of the men is considered serious.


