

GOVERNMENT DECLARES STRIKE BEYOND PALE OF LAW. MINE WORKERS' CHIEFS REFUSE CALL OFF STRIKE. SENATE CONSIGNS MOSES' AMENDMENT TO DISCARD

DEFEAT PROPOSAL BY 47-10-36 VOTE AFTER HOT DEBATE

Forty-Six Suggestions of Foreign Relations Committee Are Rejected.

JOHNSON'S RESOLUTION IS KILLED OUTRIGHT

Determined Group Will Now Fight to Eliminate Labor Section.

SAYS GRAVE PERIL THREATENS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—The forty-six amendments attached to the peace treaty by the Foreign Relations Committee passed into history today, when the last survivor of the group, a proposal by Senator Moses, Republican of New Hampshire, to revise voting strength in the league of nations was consigned to the discard in the Senate by a vote of 47 to 36.

Will Fight Labor Section.

Tomorrow a determined group of Senators will launch a fight to eliminate the labor section of the treaty, opening a debate which, in view of the bitter opposition to the labor section, is expected by the leaders to last at least a week. The battle is expected to be the more spirited because it is regarded as holding out whatever hope remains of writing any amendment in the treaty.

Says Grave Peril Threatens.

As usual, the greater part of the day's debate related to subjects aside from the matters directly under consideration. He added that he did not think before the Senate at all, got the biggest share of attention, Senator La Follette, Republican of Wisconsin, centering discussion about it with a three-hour speech assailing the proposed international labor organization as filled with American labor.

TWO MEN SHOT DOWN IN NEW YORK RAID

Federal Agents Enter Saloon and Directly Gun Play Is Begun by Occupants.

NEW YORK, Oct. 29.—Two men shot and six arrests were made by agents of the United States revenue service tonight during a raid on a saloon in the theater district. The Federal agents, bent upon enforcing the war-time prohibition law, had barely entered the saloon when a "rough house" started. One of the Federal agents whipped out a gun and started shooting. That stopped the brawl and when the smoke had cleared away one man had a bullet in his leg and another had a scalp wound. Both were arrested, together with the proprietors and bartenders and chauffeur.
