Cornier-Stone Laid and Structure is Dedicated With Much Ceremony.

The cornerstone was laid under the auspices of the local lodge of Odd Fellows, after which a stirring educational address on the subject of "Some Modern Ideals in Education" was delivered by President A. B. Chandler, Jr., of the Fredericksburg State Normal School.

The ladies' committee furnished a splendid lunch, which was sold for the school fund. After lunch, Congressman S. Otis Bland, of this district, delivered a patriotic address. A large crowd was in attendance.

ALBERT CLAIBORNE KILLED BY "CANNON BALL" TRAIN Farmer Struck at Crossing Near Disputanta—Two Hurt in Automobile Crash.

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] PETERSBURG, Va., Nov. 3.—Albert Claiborne, 46, farmer, living in Prince George County, was instantly killed this morning when the wagon in which he was riding was struck by the east-bound "Cannon Ball" train on the Norfolk and Western Railway just beyond Disputanta.

According to reports from the scene of the accident, the view of the crossing was not obstructed, and the train could be seen from either side of the track for several miles. The engine struck the horse and wagon with terrific force, throwing Claiborne from the wagon to one side of the track, crushing his skull. The horse was instantly killed and the wagon smashed to pieces.

[By Associated Press.] PARIS, Nov. 3.—Snow has fallen over all Austria, in portions of Hungary, and reports reaching the peace conference indicate that the suffering is very intense, both in Vienna and Budapest, because of lack of fuel and food. The situation at Budapest is made worse by the presence of the Roumanian troops, who are reported still seizing foodstuffs and supplies of all sorts, regardless of the warnings of the supreme council.
