LEXINGTON IS BIG GAINER FROM CLASSIC TURF EVENT

City Will Collect \$1,000 Daily During Spring Racing Meet Under Old Law.

LEXINGTON, KY., March 14.—While the proponents of the law fixing the license from race tracks at \$2,500 per racing day for State purposes, and in lieu of all other license or excise taxes, were not agreeable to an amendment proposed by Senator J. W. Stoll, of this city, which would permit cities where race tracks are located to collect a tax not exceeding \$500 daily for municipal purposes, it is today pointed out that the city of Lexington will collect \$1,000 daily license for the spring meeting here.

Prior to the action of the General Assembly on the race track license bill, which was concluded by its passage through the House of Representatives at Frankfort, the Lexington City Commission had adopted an ordinance fixing licenses to be paid during the year 1920, and one item in that ordinance is the \$1,000 daily tax on the race track of the Kentucky Jockey Club. The State law does not become effective until June, and the meeting here will not be held until the first of Covington, whereby a payment of \$200 daily is to be made for each racing day.
