WILSON LOSES TO COLTS BY 7-TO-0 SCORE

"LEFTY" KIRCHER ALLOWS TARHEELS ONLY ONE HIT

Richmond Pitcher Holds Visitors Scoreless, While Colts Pile Up Seven Runs—To Games Today.

One high, long, bounding ball from the bat of Hugh Helder Zillinger, which landed between the pitcher's box and shortstop, rebounded "Lefty" Kircher, the premier pitcher of the Colts' hurling staff, of a no-hit game yesterday afternoon at Boulevard Field in the national contest of the season between Richmond and Wilson. The final score stood, Richmond, 7; Wilson, 0.

Kircher, who is sought by several major league clubs, pitched one of the most remarkable games seen in this city in recent years. He turned the leading host back during the inning, and only one visitor hit the ball to the outfield during the nine innings. The only visitor who reached base, flied to Smith in center field in the eighth for the only chance a Richmond pitcher has had during the afternoon. Aside from pitching an effective game, Kircher possessed excellent control, walking only one man.

Tarheels Had Single Chance. Wilson had only one chance to score. This came in the first inning, as the visitor's manager, Knapp, sacrificed him to second. The batter reached first safely when Kircher attempted to head Gaston at second. The Wilson pilot was caught at third when Kircher threw to Arragon on Sharp's bunt. A fast double play, Stuart to Baker to Poole, killed the visitors' chance to register a tally. This was the only inning in which a Wilson player reached second base.

Kircher retired the visitors in order in the second, third, fourth, sixth, eighth and ninth innings. The Tarheels got one man into the field on Zillinger's infield hit, but he never advanced, as Stuart's judicious grounder and retired the runner at second. Stuart's error of Schweitzer's grounder allowed Helder to reach first in the seventh with two outs, but Zillinger went out to Poole.

Although defeated, Mehan, the Wilson pitcher, allowed but six hits. One of the safeties came in the fourth frame and, coupled with two errors, netted the Colts two runs. Tommy Abbott, the Colts' catcher, was responsible for the pair of runs, singling to center field with Stuart's third and charging on second. Poole's single to center with Abbott on second scored one run for the locals in the seventh. A double by Arragon, singles by Stuart and Kircher and two errors gave the Colts four runs in eighth.

Jesse Baker, the Colts' shortstop, and Schweitzer, the Wilson left fielder, exchanged the contest with great catches. Schweitzer went nearly to the left-field fence after Baker's fly in the first inning, while Jesse made a great stop of Schweitzer's hard drive in the fifth, retiring the batter at first.

Tommy Abbott lead in the batting, getting three singles out of three times at the plate. Two games will be played this afternoon between the Colts and the Tarheels, the first starting at 2:30 P. M.
