

DANIELS BLAMES G. O. P. FOR PRESENT CONDITIONS

Secretary Says Republican Tax Planks Duplicate Words of Secretary of Treasury.

1918 PROMISES ARE BROKEN

"Vote for Harding and End Wilsonism" Characterized by Cabinet Member as Parrot Cry Defeating Progressive Measures.

(By Associated Press.) RICHMOND, Va., Oct. 7.—Secretary Daniels, speaking at a Democratic meeting tonight, laid blame for present world conditions at the door of the Republican party.

"Not only have the Republicans failed to do things themselves," he said, "but they have attempted to hold up progressive legislation advocated by the Democrats."

"A reading of the Republican platform will disclose that the only tax reforms they promise now are in almost the exact words of those urged by the Secretary of the Treasury while Congress was in session," said Secretary Daniels.

"The Republicans obtained power in 1918 by false promises. They promised to reduce taxes and to reduce the cost of living and immediately to pass laws to fulfill those pledges. They cannot point to a law that has reduced Federal taxes or reduced the cost of living or brought certainty and stability to the country."

"Thousands Echo Parrot Cry." "Vote for Harding and End Wilsonism," is the parrot cry of thousands of special pleaders who are seeking the votes of the people. They say "down with Wilsonism," thereby meaning down with the scores of progressive measures and sound fiscal policies which conducted the war without scandal, took 4,900,000 men from simple pursuits and put them into fighting service without disrupting production or business and in fact increasing profits and the pay of labor.

"Their 'down with Wilsonism' culminates in their super-heated and variegated hostility to the covenant of the treaty of peace. This is not because they at heart oppose a league of nations, but because they are so obsessed by envy of Wilson that they would oppose the ten commandments if the supposed Wilson wished to secure their observance.

"Nobody sent us to fight in Europe when there was no league of nations; nobody but American authorities can send us to fight under the league. But just as surely as national honor and national duty compel us to go to the war in 1917, just as surely the same high motives compel us either to take steps now to prevent another world war or will compel us again to put out the raging fires which will blaze forth unless the nations make an effective league of nations for the prevention of war."
