FOLKES ADVOCATES ABOLITION OF TAX ON BANK DEPOSITS

The United States government is working along this line. Until March, 1922, it will allow railroads to make application for loans for extensions and rehabilitation, and upon proper collateral will loan from a fund of several hundred million dollars to the railroads and allow them five years to repay at 4 per cent.

The banking interests of the State are, in a large degree, under the commission, and I believe it would assist them in these times, if the tax on deposits was abolished. It should be abolished, and the commission should advocate it.

The commission erred in raising the telephone rates in the larger cities of the Commonwealth, and if elected I will vote to reduce this rate. Certainly the commission should have asked for a recommendation from the governing bodies of the cities affected before acting.


