Machine Guns and Tanks Guard Streets in Glasgow

LONDON, April 12.—Five hundred marines, with machine-guns and tanks, were dispatched to Glasgow tonight to re-enforce the already striven military forces there in dealing with the coal strike situation. This action came as the result of threatened serious developments in that quarter following the rejection by the strikers of terms of settlement proposed by Premier Lloyd George in conference today.
