

PREPARE TO OPEN CAMPAIGN FOR RED CROSS ROLL CALL

Headquarters Will Be Opened Tomorrow at 32 North Seventh Street, With Mrs. E. Aubrey Young, Chairman, in Charge—Business Houses Help.

Headquarters for the Red Cross annual roll call will be opened tomorrow morning, at 32 North Seventh Street, with Mrs. E. Aubrey Young, chairman, in charge. The roll call committee is composed of the following members:

Although the roll call does not open officially until November 11, the chairmen of special committees have started to work distributing supplies and enrolling members. There are five classes of membership in the American Red Cross: Patron membership, \$100; life membership, \$50; sustaining membership, \$10; contributing membership, \$5; annual membership, \$1. All of these are in addition to the Red Cross Endowment Fund, which takes care of disaster relief. All except 50 cents of the other three classes is retained by the chapter for local Red Cross work. The annual, \$1 membership, is the most popular membership, and is the one stressed by the Richmond Chapter. Besides a Red Cross button and a receipt, every person joining the Red Cross during the roll call is entitled to a window card. The roll call committee asks all members to wear their buttons during the period of the roll call.

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
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
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
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
