Bancroft Says There Will Be No Changes Here.

SHORT LINE OFFICES TO STAY

Union Pacific Offices Will Remain in Omaha.

New Head of the Great Railroad System Pays a High Tribute to Salt Lake's Climate.

Vice-President and General Manager W. H. Bancroft of the Union Pacific and Oregon Short Line talked rather freely yesterday regarding the rumors that have been afloat since his election. He said emphatically that there would be absolutely no change in the personnel of the office forces here, and that the rumor about doing away with the Short Line office forces and merging them with the Union Pacific offices had absolutely no foundation.

"This is the finest climate in the world," said he when he was asked how soon he would start out again. "All over the East and Middle States they are having it away below zero, and even at the river it got down to 17 below. But here it is just cold enough to be pleasant."

Mr. Bancroft expects to leave for Omaha today, if a severe cold is improved. Install Block System. San Francisco, Cal., Jan. 29.—The Southern Pacific Railroad company is preparing to install the block system in signaling on the mountain division of its northern overland route. The work will be completed as soon as possible, and will greatly lessen the danger of collisions.

Home From Calientes.

Chief Engineer H. Hawgood and Assistant Chief Engineer H. M. McCartney of the San Pedro came in last night from an inspection of the work at Calientes and west of that place. Mr. Hawgood had little to say, but expressed himself as being very well satisfied with the progress made by the construction companies. He said that the work is going on as fast as is possible for the men to shove it, and that the stories about the wonderful speed of the tracklaying machine are fabrications, less than a mile a day being good time.
