While the Legislature was in session several bills were introduced in regard to granting booming privileges on the Clearrater river and its tributaries. There were two conflicting propositions, one known as the Weyerhauser and the other known as the Schofield propositions, The bills for both propositions were defeated, owing to the demand for "an open river to the sea" cry that was raised in north-

to the sea" cry that was raised in northern Idaho.

An application for a booming franchise on the Clearwater river was filed after the Legislative session adjourned, by Francis E Jenkins, G. C. Fickett and H. Smith Wooley. As soon as this application was filed the attack was made on the confirmation of the nomination of H. Smith Wooley for United States assayer it Bolse, Ida. Most of the animus seemed to originate in Lewiston, Ida.

There is no great aslary attached to the effice and it is of no political significance, as all its minor officials are selected by drill service rules.

The opposition to the appointment of Wooley did not arise from the fact that he was a Mormon, but was fostered solely by fival timber syndicates, who wished to even themselves up by sinaphtering Wooley's appointment as assayer.

The application of Jenkins, Pickett and Mooley for a franchise was rejected by the State Land Board. To these causes may be auributed all the troubles that have besset H. Smith Wooley.

The meeting of the Republican State committee at Boise, Ida., a few, days ago

was simply a meeting to determine the time of holding the two State conventions. The committee passed a few compilmen-tary resolutions indorsing the adminis-tration of Pressure. tration of Roosevelt.

Because resolutions were not passed in regard to the present State administra-tion, the Democratic politicians and Dem-

tion, the Democratic politicians and Democratic paners tried to make a lot of cheap political capital out of the situation. They claimed that it was a personal thrust at Gov. John T. Morrison and predicted the downfall of the Republican party in Idaho this year.

The Republican State central committee really had no right to pass any resolutions whatever. The coming State convention to nominate delegates to the national Republican convention, have the right. NOT GUILTY IS VERDICT.

ST. LOUIS MILLIONAIRE AC-CUSED OF BRIBERY AC-QUITTED BY JUBY.

Fulton, Mo., Feb. 6 .- The jury in the case of Col. Ed Butler, the millionaire St. Louis politician, on trial on a charge of bribing nineteen members of the House of Delegates of St. Louis today returned a verdict of not guilty.

When the verdict was read a dozen of Col. Butler's friends gave forth a wild shout and dashed out into the street to spread the news. Butler stepped quickly forward and shook hands with Foreman Rosser. Then he walked down the line of jurors, shaking hands with each. Within a few minutes Judge Graves polled the jury and discharged them.

Friends surrounded Col. Butler and be held an informal levee, laughing and joking with those about him.

Circuit Attorney Folk of St. Louis. who was in the courtroom, appeared dumfounded

"I thought the State had a good case," he said. "Beyond that I have nothing to say at this time."

About eighteen ballots were taken, according to Foreman Rosser and at the start the jury stood ten for acquittal and two for conviction.

"One of these voting to convict changed after the first ballot," said Mr. Rosser. "The other man held out stubbornly until 9:45 o'clock this morning, when he finally came into line.
"The jurors did not want to convict the defendant on the testimony of boodlers and perfurers, whose state-ments were flatly contradicted by men of good character.

'Again, we did not think the circumstances pointed to the defendant's guilt. On the evidence of the State, even though we thoroughly credited it there was serious doubt as to Butler guilt. Weighing the facts carefully, w think we did our full duty fairly and impartially."


