

WHAT ARBOR DAY MEANS TO UTAH

State Superintendent Nelson Writes to the School Children Setting Forth Their Duty.

State Superintendent of Schools A. C. Nelson has written a letter to the school children of Utah, to be read by the teacher in each class room as a part of the programme for arbor day.

"To the school children of Utah--When the cold, bleak days of winter give way to the warm, sunny days of spring, and when the grass and early flowers spread their beauty around our homes and the birds sing sweetly to us from the trees, we become eager to show our appreciation of these as well as of other welcome blessings of the springtime.

"Arbor day, as you may know, had its birth thirty-two years ago in the State of Nebraska, and it is now being celebrated in every State in the Union. Many European countries, convinced of the far-reaching benefits which the proper observance of the day brings, have also adopted plans to increase and perpetuate the growth of their woodlands.

"I believe that the people of Utah in general, and that the school children in particular, are as loyal to their State as the people elsewhere. Let us then, on this day, in our school exercises manifest this love for our State by carrying out the purposes of the day as faithfully as they have been carried out in Nebraska or elsewhere.

"I desire to suggest that the greatest possible care be used both in the selection of the trees and of the places where they shall be planted. The trees should be valuable and they should also be adapted to our climate. They should be planted where they will receive that care necessary to insure a healthy, vigorous life.

"Bear in mind that in tree culture as in the culture of our own lives, welcome and profitable returns are realized not from what is planted merely, but from what is planted which are cultivated to their greatest possibilities. I believe that you will not be satisfied until you have planted a beautiful and useful tree today. I hope that you may be equally anxious every day of your lives to plant seeds of usefulness and unselfishness in your hearts that you may grow up to honor and adorn the State which is so fortunate to have you.

A. G. Stolper, who is mining extensively in Dry canyon, in the Ophir district, is in the city from LaCygne, Kan., where he has been spending the winter. Pipe lines from sixty to eighty miles in length will connect the new fields with the refinery. MARINE SENT BACK TO THE MENTAL HOSPITAL

After Marine's discharge from the asylum last May his relatives started a big sensation by circulating stories of inhuman cruelty practiced by the officers. Marine still maintains that he was roped to chairs and maltreated and not given anything to eat for days at a time.

Since the time of Marine's release his father and brother on two different occasions have had him brought before the proper officials for examination as to his sanity. Although his sanity appears to be perfectly harmless, his relatives say that he becomes violent and that they fear violence. He was brought before District Attorney Elchert and County Clerk James yesterday and re-committed. Deputy Sheriff Butler took Marine to Provo last night.

DES MOINES, Ia., April 2--Charles W. Green, under indictment for murdering his wife and burning her body, refused to leave his cell today and escape with some fellow prisoners who were walking up and down in his cell when the turnkey discovered that L.
