PLENTY OF WATER FOR LITTLE CASH

City Council Will Take Up the Emigration Canyon Project at Once.

INCREASE of the city's water supply by utilizing the underground flow of Emigration Canyon is a proposition which is likely to receive active attention at the hands of the City Council. A visit to the canyon for the purpose of investigating conditions there was made yesterday by the Water Works committee of the Council, accompanied by Mayor Richard P. Morris, City Engineer Snow and Land and Water Commissioner Luce.

The committee agreed last night that it would not be ready with a recommendation before next Monday night, but it was plain that the members were favorably impressed with what they saw on the trip.

"It was my first visit to the canyon," said City Engineer Snow, "and while I have no desire to forecast the action of the Council on the matter, I am free to confess that I regard the conditions now existing as a thorough investigation of what can be done in the way of increasing the water supply from that source. It is my opinion that a shaft sunk in lieu of the old sump which looks after the canal for the city, connected with the canal further down by tunnel, would strike an underground flow of water which would be well worth going after. I know of places which would be less promising where large supplies of water are being taken in that way at comparatively small cost."

Councilman Black, who has long been an advocate of this method of adding to the water supply, is confident that there is an underground flow of from five million to ten million gallons per day in Emigration Canyon which can be secured by the city with an outlay of only about \$250,000.

The street committee voted at last night's meeting to lay over the matter of paving State street until after the report of the Finance committee on the state of the city's finances should have been received by the Council. This committee was waiting upon by a delegation of women from the southwestern part of the city in the interest of further drainage work in the vicinity of Eighth West and Fourth and Fifth South streets. The city engineer was instructed to make an investigation and report upon the feasibility of making further improvements in that direction.

City Engineer Snow presented a new model for the improvement of Brigham street. It embraces several of the better features both of the plan offered by Col. Wall and the one presented by Spencer Clawson, and, it is believed, does away with some of the objectionable features of each. The Council will probably consider it at the next meeting.

POLITICAL GOSPEL

ONE OF SALT LAKE'S best-known Democrats, a gentleman who has been considered as one of the six who will likely go to the Democratic National convention, is of the opinion that Representative Hearst will control the St. Louis convention. He says that there is not the ghost of a show for the Parkers to change the time-honored two-thirds rule, as has been suggested, and that Hearst is absolutely certain of having more than one-third of the delegates.

"I am not a delegate or I would tell you what I think of the Parker-Hearst fight for control. I do not know whether or not I may be a delegate. I think that there is not any material difference between the two leading candidates so far as vote-getting is concerned. Each candidate has strong and weak points. The party will not unite on either, but there will be enough disgruntled Republicans to elect either of them. It is my opinion that they will win this year, or they would not be making such a fuss over their respective candidates. It is my opinion that the apparent apathy of the Hearst forces during the past two weeks, here as elsewhere, is a part of the young man's strategy. He is waiting until he is so sorely for a time that it was the act of a good general to retire for a while. He will only be the most powerful man in the convention, even if he does not have enough votes to secure the nomination for himself."

According to the views of the Democrat quoted, the Hearstites are "sawing the log" and the Parkers are "cutting the wood." The latter are doing little else. The latter may make up the morning after the State convention very much like a distinguished Democrat of the old school did a good many years ago.

DEATH RESULTED FROM NATURAL CAUSES

That death resulted from natural causes was the finding of the Coroner's jury yesterday in the case of Samuel Steward, whose body was found last Sunday in the abandoned shack at 26 South Third West street. Steward was a man of limited mental capacity, it developed, who has lived in and about the city for the last twenty years, relying mainly upon charity for a precarious existence, although it is believed that he was something of a miser. It was a custom of his to occasionally pay tithing to the Methodist church of five, ten and twenty cents, very soon afterward calling upon the church authorities for assistance in the amount of several dollars and frequently causing his residence from one ward to another in order to further his chances for securing aid.

A banker told the coroner's jury that Steward had called at his bank at times with considerable sums in small change, for which he would obtain \$20 bills. A pocket-book containing about 50 cents in silver was found among his effects, and it is considered not unlikely that a considerable amount of money may have been stowed away in the gunny-sacks filled with rags which formed his bed and which were turned by the health authorities.

Steward had no relatives here, so far as known. From a tablet in which he had written the names of Washington and Essex, England, February 11, 1848.

MORE ENERGY FOR LIGHT AND POWER

Additional energy for the moving of cars and the furnishing of electric lights to the extent of 1000 horse power is to be provided by the Utah Light and Railway company's Bear River power plant. The sugar company came to the rescue of the light and railway company last fall by constructing two units of a four unit, or four thousand horse power plant, on Bear river, the power of which was all turned over to the latter company. In spite of the acquisition and the rapid extensions made to its power stations in this city, the light and railway company is still demanding more power and the sugar people are again coming to its relief. Another unit of one thousand horse power capacity will be added to the Bear river plant this summer, to be completed by October 1st, and the sugar company is prepared to add the fourth unit to its plant next year if it should be required.
