

MAJOR HOOPER IN THE CITY

Will Give Utah Great Fishing.

Has Plans for Stocking All Local Streams Next Year With Small Trout.

Already Filled Colorado Waters and Made a Start in the Provo, but Will Finish Utah Streams.

Maj. S. K. Hooper, general passenger agent of the Denver & Rio Grande system, arrived from Denver yesterday, and will be here several days in consultation with General Agent Benton and in visiting various passenger officials in the city on business pertaining to that department.

Maj. Hooper, speaking of the future yesterday, stated that traffic in the passenger department both east and west-bound, continues to be very encouraging, and he looks for a heavy winter movement next year to the Lewis and Clark exposition at Portland.

During the past season he was instrumental in planting over 6,000,000 trout in streams along the railway, mostly in Colorado, although several large consignments were planted in Provo river. This year he will have most of the fish sent to Utah streams, and they will be placed in the water wherever there is room for them.

NOTICE OF A SPECIAL ELECTION UPON THE QUESTION OF INCURRING BONDED INDEBTEDNESS.

Whereas, The City Council of Salt Lake City, Utah, by an ordinance duly passed by a majority of the council on the 21st day of November, 1904, and approved by the Mayor of said city on the 22nd day of November, 1904, did order a special election to be held in said city on the 3rd day of January, 1905, for the purpose of submitting to such qualified electors as shall have paid a property tax in said city for the year 1904, the question of incurring a bonded indebtedness in the sum of eight hundred and fifty thousand (\$850,000) dollars for the purpose of increasing the water supply of said city, and also the question of incurring a bonded indebtedness in the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand (\$150,000) dollars for the purpose of defraying the expenses of establishing sewer mains and sewers in the southern and western portions of said city where no sewerage system now exists.

Now therefore, Pursuant to the terms and directions of said ordinance, and under and pursuant to sections 34, 39 and 40 of the revised statutes of Utah of 1898, notice is hereby given that on the 3rd day of January, 1905, in Salt Lake City, Utah, a special election shall be held for the purpose of submitting to the vote of such qualified electors as shall have paid a property tax in said city for the year 1904 the following questions to wit: 1. The question of incurring a bonded indebtedness in the sum of eight hundred and fifty thousand (\$850,000) dollars for the purpose of defraying the expenses of increasing the water supply of said city by laying pipes to said city sewerage system to conduct water from Big Cottonwood creek and Mill creek and their tributaries to Salt Lake City, and acquiring water rights in said streams and in Utah lake, and by improving and extending the present system of water distribution by which water is now distributed throughout said city.

Also the question of incurring a bonded indebtedness in the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand (\$150,000) dollars for the purpose of defraying the expenses of establishing sewer mains and sewers in the southern and western portions of Salt Lake City where no sewerage system now exists. Said sewerage system and sewerage system shall be owned by Salt Lake City. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, which interest shall be payable semi-annually, and said bonds shall become due and payable at the date of issue with the option reserved to the city to pay or refund the same at any time after the expiration of ten years from the date of issue, and shall be of such denomination or denominations as the Council may hereafter determine, and the revenues from said water system shall be set apart for and shall be a sinking fund for the payment of said bonds and interest thereon. Said election shall be conducted according to the statutes and laws of Utah, and shall be held in manner and form provided thereby.

The report of a special committee heretofore appointed by the Council to examine into questions pertaining to the water supply of Salt Lake City and the proposed increase of said water supply by the establishment of a sewerage system, which report was adopted by the City Council on the 21st day of November, 1904, and approved by the Mayor of said city on the 22nd day of November, 1904, immediately follows this notice, and said report contains information concerning said water and sewerage system, and said proposed improvements. 

To the Honorable President and Members of the City Council of Salt Lake City: Gentlemen—Your special committee, to whom was referred by the Council a report of a plan for obtaining an adequate water supply for Salt Lake City, reports as follows: Immediately after its appointment the committee commenced its labors, and the same have been prosecuted with diligence until the present time. It has proceeded upon the theory that no temporary expedient should be resorted to in this important matter, but that a plan should be devised which would provide for a constant adequate water supply, and thus afford a permanent solution of this momentous question.

It was found, upon investigation, that there was not sufficient data at hand from which the sources of supply, their availability and the manner and cost of bringing the water to the city, could be determined, although it was generally conceded that the sources of supply would be from the streams flowing into Salt Lake County from the West. In order that the committee might act intelligently, the City Engineer was requested to make such investigation of the subject as would be necessary to the possession of the necessary facts upon which to base its report to your honorable body. In response to this request the Engineer has prepared and submitted the full and comprehensive statements which accompany this report. The report states that Salt Lake City's present supply of water per day of 24 hours, based on September averages for the years 1901, 1902 and 1903, a period of unusual scarcity, is: City creek..... 4,500,000 gallons. Parley's creek..... 4,500,000 gallons. Emigration creek..... 1,000,000 gallons. Total..... 10,000,000 gallons.

This is a daily supply of 150 gallons per capita for the 65,000 water users now in the city. The Engineer gives it as his opinion that 200 gallons daily per capita, as an average supply, would be none too much. From the report it appears that the quantities of water that can ultimately be made available from the various sources, per day of 24 hours, will be as follows: Mill creek..... 7,000,000 gallons. Big Cottonwood creek..... 7,000,000 gallons. Little Cottonwood crk..... 7,000,000 gallons. Total..... 21,000,000 gallons.

And that through the expenditure of \$2,000,000 above the \$500,000 already expended, water can be made available at once. All of the above water supply ultimately is acquired by the city, either through exchange or lease with the present owners. To accomplish this it will be necessary to first provide an adequate supply of water to take the place of that from the above named streams, which is now used for irrigation. Two-thirds of the waters of Mill creek and Big Cottonwood creek are used on lands lying under the present city canal, and the quantity per day of 24 hours that can be procured by immediate exchange from those streams is as follows: Mill Creek..... 5,100,000 gallons. Big Cottonwood creek..... 18,100,000 gallons. Total..... 23,200,000 gallons.
