WASHINGTON, April 19.—Victor Morawetz of the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe railroad was again before the Senate Committee on Interstate Commerce today.

Reaches an Understanding.

The railroad he said, talked things over and reached an understanding as to what rates would be from competitive points.

Explains Fuel Affair.

In reply to a question by Senator Dolliver, Morawetz explained the charges regarding the granting of rebates by the Atchison to the Colorado Fuel and Iron company.

Went Out of Coal Business.

Mr. Morawetz said when the present management of the Atchison road took control of the system it included various coal companies, the stock of which was sold.

Complaint Due to Mistake.

The agreement was to last five years, but the Atchison made a mistake in retaining the various companies from continuing this business.

Suffers From Interference.

In answer to Senator Newlands, Mr. Morawetz said that in several States there were commissions with power to fix rates.

Uncle Sam Stood
Behind Panama

Minister Prevented an Insurrection
by Telling Soldiers United States
Would Deal With Them.

WASHINGTON, April 19.—Diplomatic correspondence made public at the State department today contains a dispatch from Minister Barrett at Panama giving an account of the assistance rendered by him in averting trouble there at the time of the attempted revolution led by Gen. Huertas last November.

Soldiers Demand Pay.

After it had been arranged that Gen. Huertas should resign and the Panama army disbanded a hitch occurred. About fifty soldiers marched, unarmed, to the Government house, followed by a great crowd, and informed the President of the republic that they would not accept the Government's terms of being paid off in two payments, but demanded the whole pay at that time.

Barrett Makes Threats.

"When this word came up from the street I saw that there must be no further delay in bringing matters to an end, and, taking Gen. Guardia, the Minister of Foreign Affairs and War, with me, I went downstairs and out upon the sidewalk in front of the soldiers who were there assembled, in brief words I told Gen. Guardia to say to them that the United States with its forces stood back of the Government in this crisis and that they must accept the terms of the Government or accept the consequences.

Marines Would Be Used.

"They were warned that if they did not accept these terms and engaged in any acts of insurrection, riot or mutiny they would be dealt with in a most summary way, and that if necessary the naval forces in the bay and the marines at Ancon and Empire would be used to maintain order, with the severest punishment for those who were responsible for disorder.

Had Desired Effect.

"This order had the desired effect and the soldiers immediately declared that they would accept the terms of the Government."
