SHE KEPT BOARDERS ALTHOUGH WEALTHY

Daughter of Rich Londoner Discovered in Humble Circumstances in Newark.

NEW YORK, Sept. 5.—A woman who has been known as Frances Blind since her infancy, 33 years ago, has been found, after months of search, by the British Consul in New York as the keeper of a boarding-house in Newark, and informed that her real identity has been hidden from her all her life.

She was brought to this country as an infant by the governess in the Boutwell family, Mrs. Catherine Blind, Mrs. Blind, with her husband, settled in Newark, and was regularly supplied with money with which to rear the child.

ROOSEVELT TAKES IN FORMER CLASSMATE

New Assistant Secretary of State Is an Alumnus of Harvard.

NEW YORK, Sept. 5.—Robert Bacon, selected by President Roosevelt to become Assistant Secretary of State, began his business career shortly after being graduated from Harvard in 1880, in the same class as President Roosevelt.

From the time he entered Mr. Morgan's firm until he retired from active business in 1903, Mr. Bacon was regarded in Wall street as a dominant factor in the interests represented by the Morgan firm.

Mr. Bacon's next great financial work was the direction of the British end of the steamship merger, which resulted in the formation of the International Mercantile Marine company early in 1902.

Mr. Bacon retired from J. P. Morgan & Co. in 1903, his health being assigned as the cause. Mr. Bacon was born in Boston about forty-five years ago, and comes from old New England stock.
