

COPPER AND TIN ARE LOWER IN LONDON

Prices of Iron Also Recede a Shade, While Lead Is Higher.

NEW YORK, Oct. 9.—There was a very severe break in the London tin market, said to reflect speculative liquidation, and spot closed at \$145.10 and futures at \$144.10, or about 13 1/2 c below the closing figures of last Friday. Locally, the market was dull and lower in sympathy, with spot quoted at \$137.50-82.00.
