

GRAND CENTRAL IS THE VICTOR

Mining Litigation of Unusual Interest Reached Decision in Supreme Court.

SUIT WAS FILED MORE THAN SIX YEARS AGO

Action Involved Apex Question on Silveropolis Claim in Tintic District.

The Supreme court yesterday, in an opinion of great length, decided in favor of the Grand Central Mining company in its long-pending litigation with the Mammoth Mining company.

The opinion of yesterday affirms the decision given by Judge Maroneux in the District court for Salt county. Chief Justice Bartch wrote the opinion, which was concurred in by Justices McCarty and Straup.

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In Favor of Grand Central. The decision of the court covers only the question of title to the ground in dispute, which is awarded to the Grand Central company, the matter of the \$200,000 alleged damages for ores claimed to have been extracted from the ground now awarded to the Grand Central having been held in abeyance until the determination of the question of title.

Another Action Pending. Attorney Strinfield, of counsel for the defendant Mammoth company, when seen after the afternoon adjournment, said there was another and similar action now pending in the Federal court, which had been brought through the reorganization of the Grand Central company under the laws of another State.

Does Not Claim Body.
