

NEW PHASE IN IMPORTANT CASE

Judge Marshall Reinstates Injunction in Noted Kempton Mining Litigation.

ORE BODIES IN QUESTION ARE WORTH MILLIONS

Action Will be Reviewed by the Highest Court in the United States.

A new phase of the interesting and important case of the United States Mining company vs. L. M. Lawson et al. developed yesterday in the reinstatement by Judge Marshall of the injunction, dissolved last August, prohibiting the extraction of ore by the plaintiff company.

Bingham Ground in Question

The ground of which the title is in dispute comprises the developed ore bodies of the Kempton and Ashland claims of Bingham, now owned by Col. Wall and his associates.

United States Company Lost

The United States company lost its suit when the action was tried in the Federal court here, the decision was reversed in the Circuit Court of Appeals, and the defendants carried the action to the Supreme court of the United States on application for a writ of certiorari, which was granted without argument by that highest tribunal, following which the application for reinstatement of the injunction, pending a final decision in the case, was granted, as stated, by Judge Marshall.

The granting of such a writ in cases of this character is rare, and is regarded by high legal authority in many circles as placing a favorable construction upon the contentions of the defendant interests.

Decision Will Be Final

The next decision in the action will be final, and should the judgment of the lower court be sustained and the title of the Wall interests to the ground in dispute be affirmed, grounds will exist for an action against the plaintiff company to recover the six acres of ground claimed by the plaintiffs during the period that the injunction was dissolved, being only about three weeks, an amount which will closely approximate \$4,000.

AT STONE CABIN

Strike Appears to Be One Which Deserves Recognition.

Describing the recent discoveries at Stone Cabin, the Tonopah Miner says: The principal strike was made about three weeks ago on a hill which from now on will be known as Efford Hill, about nine miles due east of Stone Cabin, two miles south of the old Overland road, and southwest of Hot Springs summit.
