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PREACHERS' BANK RUN ON DEPOSITORS' COIN

More Rascality Shown Up in Life of Rev. Simmons of Peoria.

PEORIA, Ill., Feb. 17.—John Wilton, receiver of the People's Savings bank, the private bank run by the late Rev. Dr. Simmons and Rev. Kelly, tonight made the first official statement of the bank's condition, placing the liabilities at \$145,049 and the assets at \$108,827.

The report further shows that the partnership never had a dollar of money invested in the bank, but that all its assets, including the building which it occupied, were purchased with the deposits and that the bank had been insolvent for at least six months.

The receiver expects the assets to shrink to \$96,000, or 65 cents on the dollar.

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RUSSIAN MINISTRY IN A TURMOIL

Count Witte Demands the Dismissal of Minister of the Interior.

ST. PETERSBURG, Feb. 17.—Information has reached the Associated Press that the desperate struggle which has been raging in the Government between the reactionary and the progressive forces is approaching a culmination and must end within a few days in the resignation either of Minister of the Interior Durnovo, who is leading the movement for thoroughgoing repression, or of Premier Witte and several other members of the Cabinet.

The question at issue is the withdrawal of the extraordinary powers conferred in Governor-Generals throughout Russia, which in many cases, it is alleged, have been exercised for the repression of not alone political disorders, but also of the political activity of the parties.

One Faction Must Fail. The discussion has reached such an acute and passionate stage in the Cabinet that no other issue than the fall of one faction or the other is possible.

Another Will Be "Fired." It is said that M. Kutler, who, like his predecessor, M. Yermoloff, is possessed of exceedingly strong progressive tendencies, will leave the state service entirely, not even receiving the usual "promotion" to the Council of the Empire, the body which is reserved for discarded Ministers.

Witte Still in Power. The Associated Press was authorized today at Count Witte's chancellery to deny positively the report that Count Witte had officially resigned, but the words of an official high in the Premier's confidence that he could vouch for the fact that at the present moment the report is untrue, indicates that there may be something in the wind.

Senator Tillman III. WASHINGTON, Feb. 17.—Senator Tillman of South Carolina, who is ill at his hotel in this city with a severe cold, which threatens to develop into pneumonia, was reported to be quietly sleeping tonight.

McCall Is Improving. LAKEWOOD, N. J., Feb. 17.—Late tonight it was said John A. McCall, who is recovering from the New York Life, seemed to be gaining some strength, but it is realized, however, that the present weak condition of the patient will make it difficult for him to withstand further sinking spells.

Peril to Government. M. Kutler held that this was the only means of preventing augmentation of the agrarian troubles, whose rising billows are the chief source of peril to the Government, but his proposal not only awakened the intense opposition of the rich and powerful camorra at court, but also was too drastic to suit the deputation from the convention at Moscow to demand explicitly of Premier Witte whether he intended to accept the Kutler scheme.

JAPAN SUPPORTING CHINA. Russian Government Uneasy Over Affairs in the Far East. ST. PETERSBURG, Feb. 17.—In view of recent events in China, the Russian Government, like that of the United States, has found it advisable to take the necessary military measures to be prepared for all eventualities.

U. S. TAKES CHARGE OF VENEZUELA CONSULATES

Castro's Affairs in France Are Turned Over to the American Officials.

PARIS, Feb. 17.—The United States Consul-General in Paris and the Consuls at Havre, Bordeaux, Nich, Marseilles and Nantes today received orders from the State department at Washington, through the American embassy here, to take possession of the archives of the Venezuelan consulates in those cities. The orders expressly limit the action of the Consuls to taking possession of the archives.

The effect of this is to suspend forever the old papers, whereas the limitation prevents the transaction of new consular business. The limitation follows the ruling by Premier Rouvier that Venezuela, having taken the initiative in revoking the exequatours of French Consuls in Venezuela, while also threatening to interfere with French shipping, it was incumbent upon France to follow the same course.

PARIS, Feb. 17.—With a surplus of only \$29,000, and with beneficiary claims aggregating \$106,440, the New York State Grand Lodge officers of the Ancient Order of United Workmen are preparing to appeal to the supreme lodge for relief in the greatest crisis in the history of the organization.

Life or Order at Stake. The life of the organization in this State is claimed to be dependent on securing prompt relief.

Bar to Irrigation. Ruling of Interior Department Will Injure Reclamation in Colorado. DENVER, Feb. 17.—The State Auditor's office received information today of a ruling concerning floodwaters in Colorado which, it is believed, will bar individuals and irrigation companies from using the floodwaters in this State under certain conditions.

Blow to Colorado. The decision is interpreted here as meaning that no reservoir can be constructed on streams in Colorado that are navigable for other than the State where the Government projects to build reservoirs for irrigation purposes, and is accepted as meaning that the southern California irrigation project prohibits the building of reservoirs on the Grand and other rivers in Colorado that are sources of supply of the Colorado river.
