Do you receive your mail regularly? Is it handled with such promptness as to give you satisfaction? Have you complained about delays? Were your protests heeded? These are prominent questions in Salt Lake today.

Not a day passes that business houses are not a victim of the incompetency or the willful discrimination of the Salt Lake postoffice employees. Not a day passes that some citizen does not complain of the mishandling of his mail.

Postmaster Thomas has inaugurated, or, rather, re-inaugurated, a system of double-checking mail intended for some of the business houses in Salt Lake for the purpose, he says, of determining who is responsible for the thousands of errors...

Envelopes bearing evidence from which the table of delays is made up will be held by The Tribune for inspection by Postmaster Thomas or any of his friends.

Table with 3 columns: Received, Boxed, Time required to distribute. Lists various mail items and their processing times.

One business man, a bookbinder, recently informed The Tribune that he presented a large record book at the local postoffice and it would not be accepted for transmission through the mails because it exceeded four pounds in weight.
