Abundance of Cups to Be Played for This Season.

plenty of opportunity to win cups this season, as there will be seventeen open tournaments given by clubs in the West. The tournaments managed by the association will be as follows:

- June 21, 22, Homewood Country club, Flossmoor, Ill. Western open championship; seventy-two holes, medal play; open amateurs and professionals.
 - August 6, Onwentsia club, Lake Forest, Ill. Marshall Field cup; bogey competition, thirty-six holes; open to teams of five from each club.
 - September 3, Glen Echo Country club, St. Louis, Mo. Olympic cup; open to teams of four from any golf association (not clubs) in the world; thirty-six holes, medal play; total medal scores of each team to count.

MYLNE TO CONSTRUCT NEW BOAT FOR LIPTON

Noted Young Designer Hopes to Build a Cup Winner.

LONDON, June 2.—Alfred Mylne, who has been commissioned by Sir Thomas Lipton to design a yacht, with which the Irish Baronet may challenge for a race for the America's cup, to be sailed next year, although a young man, has already made a mark as a designer. He began to work on yachts in the office of the late George L. Watson, and was regarded by Mr. Watson as a man of exceptional ability. He has been designing yachts for fifteen years, and is now about 35 years old. Mr. Watson thought so well of him that he brought him to this country in 1886 when the third Valkyrie, designed by Watson, came after the cup.

the old or the new rule of measurement she will have many new ideas in form and construction.

Started on Own Account. Mylne started on his own account as a designer in 1886. At first he confined his efforts to small yachts, and had much success with Memsahib, Zetia, Vashi and others. These were followed in rapid succession by the Valmar, Jean, Shitroon, Susette, Psyche, Gertrude, Cymbeline, Harabel and Thetis.

His first large yacht was turned out in 1888. Claude A. Allen gave him an order for a 52-footer, and the Forsa was the result of his work. In 1889 he designed the Clyde 28-ton class, and these boats were so good that they were raced until last season. In 1903 A. W. Leuchars ordered a 52-footer, and George Coats ordered a 42-footer. Both of these yachts have made history.

Pronounced Masterpiece. The 52-footer Moyana is pronounced a masterpiece. Her draught and forward grip have made her a rare boat turning to windward. She goes about with astonishing ease; with her moderate overhang she reaches steadily and with speed, and makes a fine showing down the wind. Mr. Mylne's second attempt in this class, the Britomarte, built last year for W. P. Burton, was hardly up to Moyana's standard so far as prize-winning goes, but Britomarte was something in the way of an experiment in dealing with the long overhang allowed under the rule.

Even now, with the experience of a season to judge by, it must not be too hastily decided that the yacht has fallen short of her designer's expectations. She was an improvement toward the end of the season and, like Herreshoff's Sonya, she may do better this year.

Great Rivalry Last Year. Last year there was great rivalry between the Moyana and the Maxmon, designed by Fife. The result was that the Maxmon scored 13 fifts, 11 seconds and a third out of 35 starts, and the three-year-old Moyana 12 fifts, 5 seconds and a third out of 35 starts. The Maxmon finished 34 matches and the Moyana 30. The Britomarte started 31 times and finished 25, winning 6 fifts and 10 seconds. The Sonya was the last yacht in the season record.

Last year Mylne headed the list in the six-foot class with the Thetis, and his Army was third. All the four 49-footers, with Lovel in the lead, were of his design.

WILL PLAY FOOTBALL AT COLUMBIA IN 1907

At Least, That Is the Way It Looks at the Present Time.

Tribune Special Sporting Service. NEW YORK, June 2.—The students feel confident that football will be played at Columbia in 1907. The men most interested in the question express their belief that the resumption of the game next fall is out of the question, but they reason that the student committee, seeing that there is no hope of having their recommendation accepted, will vote in favor of the graduates committee's suggestion that the game be resumed the year following. If these two committees combine they will outvote the faculty committee, and the graduates' recommendation will then go to the president. Many Favor Proposition. Further than this, it is known that many of the members of the faculty committee are in favor of reinstating football if a scheme can be evolved that will do away with the tendency to specialization or the over-development of few men, and will give a greater number of


students an opportunity of playing the game. The recommendation, moreover, that the game be reinstated in 1907 if it be found to work satisfactorily at other colleges in 1906 under the new rules, would bring no one, if acquiesced in by the authorities. The question as to whether or not the new rules proved satisfactory would be settled by the president alone, and he could, therefore, be under no obligation to reinstate the game, even if he should approve the graduate recommendation. Government of Athletics. With respect to the government of athletics, it is proposed that there shall be appointed one general athletic supervisor at the university, who shall have supreme authority over all forms of athletic activity; that he shall have ten or twelve assistants, to whom shall be apportioned the various branches of sport over which they shall have subsidiary authority; that hours during the day be set apart for the various groups of sport to accommodate the interests of the various courses of studies in the different departments to allow every student time to take part in some one sport, according to his liking; that when there shall be teams organized within these groups for the purpose of intercollegiate competition coaches may be appointed if desired. The plan, in theory, is comprehensive and satisfactory. Whether it will work so in practice remains to be seen. Star Chamber Organized. Tribune Special Sporting Service. PARIS, June 2.—A species of Star Chamber has been organized in the ring at each race meeting, and the police have had free hand given them. Betting is contrary to the law of 1881, but M. Henion, who has been specially charged to see that the law in question was not infringed, knows perfectly well that the decree signed by President Carnot does not do away with the 186th clause of the civil

code, which makes an exception in favor of bets "made on foot, horse or chariot racing." M. Henion contends that two persons may make "one" bet together, but that even a second wager to the same person renders the person accepting it liable to be included among those who "bet with all comers." A system of arbitrary persecution has been carried on under cover of the law of 1881, until sportsmen feel that they can have enough of a good thing or bad thing. The police avoid bringing any question into court unless they are certain that no defense will be offered or that a conviction can be secured before some magistrate impressed with the idea that he is serving those in power by protecting the Government monopoly.
