The Mormon church Monday donated the use of the Tabernacle for the concert May 1, the proceeds of which will be used to send the Salt Lake high school cadet battalion to San Francisco on May 2, and the concert will have to give Friday.

Fred C. Graham, who has consented to take full charge of the concert, has secured the services of Salt Lake's best singers. Rosemary Glosz, who has not been heard in Salt Lake City since her appearance upon the stage five years ago, has consented to render a vocal solo.

The order to print the tickets has been given and these will be placed on sale in all of the newspaper offices Tuesday afternoon. The High School Alumni association has agreed to contribute the seats. Knight donors' tickets will be given each high school boy and girl this afternoon and they will canvass the city thoroughly. It is believed that persons who have not contributed one ticket.

The finance committee went to work in earnest Monday morning and before the day was over had cleared up over \$1100. The Salt Lake Stock Exchange was the largest contributor. The morning session of the exchange was interrupted and \$150 secured. Ogden and Provo were both represented in the exchange. The Salt Lake Stock Exchange and Fred J. Kiesel and John Sowerett & Sons company each giving \$50.

Neither Senator Smoot nor Senatorutherland has been heard from in response to the telegram sent. A telegram was received from John Dubei, secretary of the Order of St. Augustine, he had mailed a check for \$25 Monday.

One of the most notable subscriptions was that of the Greek colony of \$75. The color has been hard by the recent panic and it is estimated that only about one-fourth of the members employed at the present time.

FLOWER FESTIVAL A GLORIOUS SIGHT

Santa Barbara's Reception of Our Great Battleship Fleet Is Brilliant Event.

GUESTS ALMOST BURIED IN SEA OF BLOSSOMS

Steps Are Taken to Maintain Severe Drill in Spite of Hours of Pleasure.

SANTA BARBARA, April 27.—A day of vivid colors flashing in the brilliant rays of an undimmed sun, a day redolent of the perfume of spring blossoms and of petal-strewn pathways, a day of gaily arrayed holiday throngs, a day of flower-decked coaches and floats passing in review before thousands of cheering people, a day of white uniforms, marching soldiers, with sudden hidden surprises, a day of flying bouquet hurled in floral warfare at the passing pageant, a day of soft southern breeze, of blue skies deepening, of blue waters, of palm-lined ocean boulevards and dancers, flowers everywhere the eye could reach, such are the memories of Santa Barbara's floral festival today in honor of the Atlantic battleship fleet. For did the festivities end with the setting of the sun, for tonight the ocean front is gay with lights, with dancing sailors gathered in an outdoor ballroom, with the radiance of the fleet illuminated, and with lively music in a light indoor hall for the officers is also a feature of the gala event.

Wonderful Spectacles. The floral parade in the afternoon, with its wonderful setting of crowds ashore and blue water and white ships and the colorful and colorful, and a picture of rainbow beauty unrivaled. The officers of the fleet, in whose honor the pageant was planned, sat in a great tribunal amphitheater at the head of the bay, the fleet, the officers, and they were insisted in their applause. The afternoon and evening of gaily ashore were preceded by a morning of hard work on most of the battleship ships at anchor in the ocean roadstead.

There are endless details of the celebrations still to come that must be settled. Preparations are being made for Admiral Thomas, who is soon to transfer his flag from the Connecticut back to the Minnesota, in anticipation of the return of Rear Admiral Evans to command of the fleet for the year.

It was officially announced during the day that Admiral Evans has decided to adhere to his original intention and instead of remaining at the Monterey on May 1, as recently announced, he will wait until the afternoon of May 5, when, just before the ship leaves Santa Cruz, he will board his old flagship, the Connecticut, and his leave will be broken from the main track.

The fleet enters the Golden Gate at noon on May 6, the review occurs in San Francisco harbor on May 8, and on May 10 Admiral Evans is expected to transfer down his flag permanently. The fleet then will pass under actual command of Admiral Thomas for five days. On May 15 he will be relieved at his own request to make way for Rear Admiral Charles S. Sperry, who is to take the ships on their world-cruise back to New York.

The Missouri May Not Sail. It was said on the fleet today that the damage to the port engine of the Missouri is so serious that there is a strong possibility of the ship not being able to accompany the fleet to the Far East in July. A new cylinder-head must be planned and cast, fitted and installed, and it is doubtful if this can be done in the time that survives before the date of departure. The Missouri will continue with the fleet to San Francisco and to Puget Sound, as the runs to the Pacific coast ports will be made in easy stages. In case the Missouri cannot go to the East, either the Maine or the Alabama will be retained in her place in the column of sixteen.


Many officers of the fleet have been applying for leave ever since the fleet reached the coast. So numerous and insistent have the requests become that Admiral Thomas issued a circular today, notifying everybody that no leaves would be granted until after the review of May 8. The fleet will leave here on Thursday at 10 a. m., and will arrive at Monterey the next morning at 7 o'clock.

After one day in Monterey the two squadrons of the fleet part company, the first going to Santa Cruz the morning of the 24th, the second squadron remains at Monterey until the afternoon of the 24th, when it sails for Santa Cruz to remain there until the afternoon of the 26th, when the reunited fleet, with Admiral Evans in command, sails for San Francisco, anchoring outside the Golden Gate the night of May 5.

SHOW BOAT CAPSIZES; TWELVE ARE DROWNED

News of Disaster at Mouth of St. Francis River Reaches Helena, Ark.

HELENA, Ark., April 27.—Twelve persons were drowned, one a woman, when the show boat Marion capsized eight miles above the mouth of the St. Francis river last yesterday. Capt. W. A. Joyce of Newport, Ark., who was in charge, returned to Helena this afternoon, bringing the information. The Marion, a sixty-five-ton boat, left Helena Sunday afternoon, carrying members of a carnival company that had been playing here. About 3:30 the boat struck and capsized. The sixty-two passengers and members of the crew climbed on top of the overturned boat and the engineer and a negro set out for shore in a skiff. Waves capsized the skiff and both were drowned. Ten-foot high waves swept the overturned steamer and several were washed from their hold, drowning before the eyes of their helpless companions.

THREE-CENT FARES PROBABLE IN CLEVELAND

CLEVELAND, April 27.—Three-cent street car fare on all lines operating within the city of Cleveland became a possibility tonight at the regular meeting of the City Council when a "security grant" was passed under suspension of the rules to the Cleveland Railway company, a new corporation which took over the consolidated properties of the old companies. At the conclusion of the Council meeting that body, as a committee of the whole, met the officials of the Cleveland Railway company, the Cleveland Electric Railway company, the Fortification Railway company and the Low Fare Railway company in the Chamber of Commerce hall, where the final papers were signed and passed, leaving the corporation to the Cleveland Railway company, the holding or operating company, for fifty years.

THROWN UNDER TRAIN. BUT ESCAPES DEATH

RENO, Nev., April 27.—A. G. Lewis, a street car conductor of Los Angeles, en route to Chicago, tried to catch his train as it moved out of the station this morning, but miraculously escaped instant death as it was, he is fearfully bruised, has a broken ankle and it is feared, is suffering from internal injuries. He was put on the train and carried east under the care of the conductor.

CASHIER ACCUSED OF EMBEZZLEMENT CAUGHT

LOS ANGELES, Cal., April 27.—Fred Lubbe, alias W. W. Williams, was arrested this afternoon for the alleged embezzlement of \$3,500 from the First National bank of Hillsboro, Ind. He had been acting as cashier of the bank since August 8, 1907, and up to the time of the embezzlement, which occurred January 7, 1908. Detectives have been searching for Lubbe for the last three weeks and located him Saturday acting as a waiter in a restaurant.

Louis K. Klaw Dies. NEW YORK, April 27.—Louis K. Klaw, brother of Marc Klaw, of the theatrical firm of Klaw & Erlanger, died today at his home in this city, aged sixty years. He had been associated with his brother in theatrical enterprises for the past twenty years.

LARGE GATHERING OF CATHOLIC PRELATES

New York Centennial Celebration Brings Together Great Leaders of Church.

NEW YORK, April 27.—Before dusk today all the American and Canadian prelates, who will participate in the public service of thanksgiving in St. Patrick's cathedral tomorrow had arrived in New York and were taken to the different hotels and private homes where they will be entertained during their stay here for the centennial of the New York diocese. Cardinal Gibbons was the first to reach the city, accompanied by his secretaries. He was driven to Archbishop Farley's house in Madison avenue, where he greeted his colleague, Cardinal Gilmour of Montreal. The meeting between the two prelates of the Catholic church was that of two brothers. They embraced each other, at the same time saying, "Pax tecum" (peace be with you, brother).

TANGIER, April 27.—Reports are in circulation here that Raisuli, the bandit, has been assassinated. The native rumors current here are to the effect that Raisuli was ambushed by a band of Eskimes while journeying toward Tazart.

GASPIPE THUGS MUST HANG, DECLARES COURT

SAN FRANCISCO, April 27.—The State Supreme Court today confirmed the judgment of the lower tribunal in the case of John Siemsen and Louis Dubner, the gaspipe thugs, who were sentenced to be hanged. Thirty days must pass before the remitter is handed down, whereupon the two men will be sentenced to hang on whatever date the Judge fixes.

HIGHWAY ROBBER IS GIVEN ONLY TEN YEARS

RENO, Nev., April 27.—John Van Thee, convicted highway robber, was today sentenced by Judge Pike to ten years imprisonment in Carson. The maximum sentence is fourteen years. A recommendation for mercy by the jury resulted four years. Van Thee thanked the Judge cordially when sentence was pronounced. Van Thee lives in Sacramento and served nine years and six months of a twenty-four-year sentence for a similar offense in the San Quentin prison in California. Upon his release he came here and immediately got into trouble.

Parliament Honors Premier. LONDON, April 27.—The House of Commons today reassembled after the Easter holidays. After listening to several speeches in which tribute was paid to the late Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman, the House adjourned until tomorrow out of respect to the memory of the late Premier.

SENATE STANDS FOR TWO BATTLESHIPS

President's Programme for Increase of Four Beaten by an Overwhelming Vote.

THREE DAYS OF HEATED DEBATE FINALLY ENDED

Naval Appropriation Bill as Passed Carries Over Hundred Twenty-Eight Millions.

WASHINGTON, April 27.—By an overwhelming vote, President Roosevelt's four-battleship programme failed in the Senate, just as it did in the House. The amendment for four battleships was introduced by Senator Piles, and the fight for its adoption was led by Senator Beveridge. Twenty-three votes were cast for the increased programme, the number being made up of recently elected Senators. Fifty senators voted to support the House and the recommendation of the Senate naval committee in favor of building only two battleships.

Two Ships Each Year.

It was developed by Senator Allison during the debate that there is a well-defined feeling among the congressional leaders for the authorization of two battleships each year until the American navy is regarded as sufficient to meet any demands that may be made upon it. As finally passed the bill carries appropriations aggregating \$123,115,659, and provides for the construction of two battleships and two colliers, and the purchase of three additional submarines, and other necessary craft, and increases the pay of officers and enlisted men, as well as increasing both the pay and the strength of the marine corps.

President Takes Credit.

Two battleships a year is what President Roosevelt says he has accomplished through his fight for his naval programme. Had he been authorized at this session, the United States could have dictated terms of disarmament to the nations of the world. This statement, made tonight following the passage by the Senate today of the naval bill calling for two new battleships, is understood to reveal the President's source of strength in the naval fight which has been waged so strenuously. Furthermore, two additional battleships would continue until the desired number of two ships each year to follow, which the President has accepted as a bonafide stipulation on the part of the Senate, means simply a programme which will place the country in the front rank of naval progression, but which fails to place it in the position of dictating a cessation of naval aggression.

MINORITY LEADER TO CONTINUE FILIBUSTER

WASHINGTON, April 27.—Before adopting a special rule which provides for considering and passing the sundry civil appropriation bill, the House today listened to Mr. Williams, the minority leader, in an explanation of the filibuster he is conducting. The filibuster, he said, will end the moment the House gives permission for the consideration of the campaign publicity bill, a bill to put wood pulp and print paper on the free list, and the anti-injunction bill. These measures, Mr. Williams stated, were all a part of the President's legislative programme. Every roll call which was taken was only an expedient to point out in my opinion the rights of laboring men. I ask that it be limited in some such way as that I have already pointed out in my previous messages, for the very reason that I do not wish to see an unmitigated effort made to destroy it. It is my duty to the Nation to provide against a repetition of the abuses which have caused the present unrest in a democratic country. It is my duty to expect permanently to thwart the determination of the great body of our citizens.

SAYS HOUSE HAS MADE RECORD FOR ECONOMY

WASHINGTON, April 27.—The record of the House has made a record for economy, said Chairman Tammey of the appropriations committee during his explanation of the sundry civil appropriation bill which was taken up today for consideration by that body. When the present session began, he said, he had pointed out the likelihood of a deficiency of \$18,000,000 for next year. With this in mind, he said the House had cut down the estimate for a total of \$10,000,000. This, he said, was the record of the House, and he added:

Must Regard People's Rights. It may be, and often is, the highest duty of a court, a legislature or an executive to resist and defy a gust of popular passion, and most certainly no public servant, whatever may be the consequences to himself, should yield to what he thinks wrong. TEDDY GOES MORE USES "BIG STICK"

President, in Another Special Message to Congress, Tells What He Wants Done.

STRONG PLEA FOR NATIONAL LAW FOR CORPORATIONS

Discusses Rights of Capital and Labor at Length, and Makes Many Suggestions.

WASHINGTON, April 27.—Conditions in both the Senate and the House were such that the special message of the President, further outlining his views as to legislation, which was sent to Congress today, received but scant attention. The message arrived late in the day, and the House was so tied up under its new rules that it could not officially receive the message, while the Senate was in the midst of consideration of the naval appropriation bill under the ten-minute rule, when the document reached the chamber. Unlike the House, the Senate permitted the formal presentation of the message, but it could not, at that time, be laid before the Senate, and by the time the usual bill had been disposed of, the hour was so late and the attendance so small that no attempt was made to read the document. The first few lines only had been pronounced by the clerk when it was suggested that the further reading should be postponed until tomorrow. This suggestion was adopted and the Senate adjourned.

Text of the Message.

The message devotes much space to advice of the President, and the incorporation law, to a discussion of the respective rights of capital and labor, and severely arraigns collusive bidding by firms or individuals in the obtaining of contracts. The document in full follows:

In my message to the Congress of March 2, 1908, I outlined certain measures which I believe the majority of our countrymen desire to have enacted into law at this session. These measures, I believe, can now be done if an earnest effort toward this end is made. Since I wrote this message an employer liability law has been enacted, which, it is true, comes short of what ought to have been done, but which does represent a real advance. Apparently there is ground to hope that there will be further legislation providing for reorganizing all employees who suffer injury or death in the public service; that there will be a child-labor law enacted for the District of Columbia, that certain measures which I have suggested will be continued with sufficient financial support to increase the effectiveness of its preparation; work that still must be taken to secure such investigations into tariff conditions by the appropriate committee of the House of Representatives and to secure the full information necessary for intelligently
