School Children of Salt Lake City to Make Monster Banner.

TO BE THE LARGEST IN THE UNITED STATES

When the grizzled veterans of the civil war from all over the country assemble in Salt Lake City next year in their annual encampment they will be presented by the school children of the city with a magnificent token of reverence—the largest hand-made American flag in the world, if the plans of D.
