

# Latest New York Fashions

NEW YORK, July 24.—At a fashionable garden party this week fashions were in astonishing numbers, and of them not a single skirt without a drape was seen. Of all tones chosen, rose color and pale green were the most in evidence. A few yellows of more or less gold tints were present and there were heliotropes and white with narrow black lines or black disks. The last were invariably accompanied by bright pearls and hats and often scarfs or sashes. One beautiful gown of white fabled printed sparsely with black dots, was worn with a sleeveless black lace coat with rose-colored sash and black hat piled high with roses. The shoes were black and the stockings rose color. This wearing of colored stockings with black and is a very unstable fashion of the day which came over from the city of Paris in the spring. With street gowns, the stockings are often the tone of the dress. While the shoes are black. There is a definite preference for black shoes for walking, but for dress costumes, shoes are the color of the gown in both of leather, or are bronze, gold or white.

The draperies of gowns are mainly at the back and sides and often extend well to the region of the bust, descending in lines which enhance the apparent length of those of the figure wearing them. Although many skirts have side trimmings, the hips are given as flat treatment as at any time during the elaborate craze. Petticoats being talked volubly and by fall there is no doubt that they will have become a shibboleth of the fashion patriots of the day. To increase the transparent effect of tulle yokes in some of the fashionable daytime gowns worn at public places, a layer of fine chiffon or tulle is used next to the flesh.

Hat makers refuse to be downed by fashion masters and are turning out new models with a dash of the old. Many others slope all the way around like a bowl or basket. One of the newest hats, called a "poodle milliner," is of Legion with the crown covered flat with velvet and the only trimming a huge camellia with foliage and buds. The flower is made of silk gauze and is often as big as a bread and butter plate. The velvet is usually of a dark color and the great rich hue of the flower is made lighter by the contrast. White chips with black velvet crowns are striking with this trimming.

Crowns of some of the handsomest dress hats are covered with lace. One thing is true of all hats of the day which are really smart—they are light

in weight. Even those with velvet put on over the straw crown are surprisingly light. The velvet used is of the thinnest silk quality, and the straw is made of the material of the present-day fancy for lightness. A good deal of black velvet, in one way or another, sometimes as strings or streamers, is being used. Wide black velvet strings that fall straight from the sides of the hat well down on the skirt.

Daytime gowns that are practically undecolored are seen more this summer than for many seasons. With the vogue for low necks, afternoon and house dresses generally are going to the usual extremes. Many necks are cut round, without a suggestion of trimming or other finish than a cord or piping. Pretty necks and faces are improved by such a style, but all others are at their worst in them. Lace frills, yoke effects, V's with fichu drapery, and flat collars of many kinds finish necks of this class.

One of the new conveniences for washable frocks is the medallion, which comes in sets of two to four at the white buttoned counters, the pieces finished at the edges or not, and fitting around the neck in style. With all their late afternoon gowns the net used is as transparent as can be. Very low necks and the Empire influence is sufficient to life. Except in strict evening gowns, the short waist is practically dead but for independent dressmakers and wearers who demand a style because they like it, and not altogether because Dame Fashion dictates it.

For a girl, the linen summer suit is by far the prettiest tailor-made in her wardrobe. Linen and youth seem to belong to each other, and the smart lines of this year's coat are especially youthful. Many of the best suits of the kind are plain but for a few embroidered details, which give originality to their style. Pretty frocks for girls are made of lawn, hand embroidered in delicate flower designs with light tints and worn with sashes the color of the needlework. The fuller skirts and occasional bolus add to such girlish set-ups. Now and then there is a painter's drapery which is simple and straight line. Tucks and shirtings have crept into the hip portions and frills at the hem.

The jumper princess of the summer may have no sleeves, it may have mere bare shoulders, but it has one or two arm coverings which come to the elbow. The half sleeves seem to combine with net and lace undergarments as well as any. Care needs to be taken to prevent such gowns from having a patchy look.

The newest coat is cut out generously under the arms and the sides are held together by cords instead of bands and straps. Allowers work lace dyed the color of the costume worn with it is one of the newest.

Linen coats with fabled gowns, the linen matching the ground color, is one of the whims of the moment. Linen straps and bands are also being used on smart frocks.

Black hats trimmed with colored flowers are having a decided vogue. A big black hat turned up on one side, with a handful of uncurled pale yellow ostrich feathers falling in a cascade over the brim. A black fine straw shape is finished with dull old gold feathers. A big black horse-hair hat is trimmed with feathers which range from the palest to a vivid cerise. The immense draped boue, often made of soft fine straw or of lustrous materials, is the latest in festation headgear. These hats are worn flat down on the head in the back, and the most usual trimming is an immense aigrette.

Natural flowers are being used for the corsage more than for corsages. The new and the newest coats have a buttonhole in which to fix the stems.

A handkerchief with thin colored edge is again given a conspicuous position in the patch pocket which has returned to the vogue of girl's coats. There is a self-conscious, apparent air about "diamonds" that elude and more "serenely" persons lament, but the girls like them.

Wheat ears of abnormal size are taking the place of the aigrette in fashionable corsages.


