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FINE WEATHER CAUSES THE SLUMP IN WHEAT

Movement of New Crop From the Northwest Gains; Reaction Late in Day.

CHICAGO, Aug. 20.—Ideal weather for the harvesting of the new crop of wheat in the northwest caused a severe slump in wheat prices today, but much of the loss was regained on covering by shorts.
