Supervisor of Census for Utah Will Soon Be Getting Busy.

Hugh A. McMillan's commission as supervisor of the census for the district of Utah is on its way, but it hasn't got here yet.

Mr. McMillan Thursday received a letter from E. Dana Durand, director of the census, to the effect that he is transmitting the president's commission of Mr. McMillan as supervisor of the census for Utah to Mr. McMillan under separate cover, by registered mail, and this explains why Mr. McMillan didn't receive the commission with the letter.

Accompanying the communication from Director Durand was a blank form of oath of office, which Mr. McMillan lost in the mail.

Mr. McMillan will go onto the payroll when he begins work, but he doesn't know when this letter is going to be received.



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DEMOCRATS OF BAY STATE NAME TICKET

Unanimity Is Strongly in Evidence: Two Former Republicans Nominated.

BOSTON, Sept. 30.—With singular unanimity the Massachusetts Democracy today in convention here named its state ticket and adopted a platform of party principles.

For governor—James H. Vahey, Waverley.

For lieutenant-governor—Eugene N. Foss, Seaside.

For secretary of state—Prof. Arthur T. Clark, Williamstown.

For treasurer and receiver-general—James H. Bryan, Westfield.

For attorney-general—Harvey N. Shepard, Boston.

For auditor—Alexis Boyer, Jr., of Southbury.

The platform declared in favor of an immediate reduction of the tariff on the necessities of life, a revivified trade treaty with Canada, the support of only such candidates for public office as are pledged to the ratification of the constitutional amendment favoring an income tax, the election of United States senators by popular vote, and direct nominations.

PEORIA, Ill., Sept. 30.—Henry H. Shuffeldt & Co., rectifiers, of this city, have secured a restraining order before Judge Kohlsaat in Chicago, directed to the commissioner of internal revenue, P. G. Rennie, collector of the Peoria district, and his force of gaugers and storekeepers, forbidding them from putting into effect the decision of Commissioner of Internal Revenue Cabell for the collection of tax on raisin wine after October 1st.


BRYAN-BAILEY DEBATE STILL HANGING FIRE
