

BREAKING RECORDS IN ROAD BUILDING

Nevada People Appreciate Efforts of Salt Lake Men.

NEW COPPER-BELT LINE PROGRESSING

Intention Is to Have Train Service Effective by First of December.

Messrs. Orem, MacViehe, Frazier and others have set all records for railroad building at nothing by accomplishing within a month more than they promised, and manyfold times as much as the usual railroad builders, says Mason Valley News.

When we come right down to doing what is started in to do, the Nevada Copper Belt has smashed all records, and whatever the unforeseen delays of the future, should there be any, the operators of this railroad have established themselves as the "get-there-est" kind.

"Things are doing" at Wabaska, the little cloud that appeared last week, in the form of an injunction, proved to be no larger than a man's hand; in fact, it had no bearing of consequence, as the railroad company was not involved. It develops that but four miles of ties and steel were bargained for Mrs. Mack, which it was intended to use for six miles, the material is on hand for the twenty-one cars of new steel that is to arrive at Wabaska prevented any prospect of a delay. However, while not of very great importance, it is a fact that Mrs. Mack in some manner adjusted the Olinhouse legal delay at this week a great deal of material arrived at Wabaska consigned from Olinhouse.

The grade is now topped for a distance of three full miles from Wabaska, leaving but eleven miles to Mason; almost one-fourth of the total distance has been covered in less than a month, including the time it required for the contractors to get equipment, after the contract was executed, and the hurry-up order went into effect.

Three miles of the grade is ready for the track-laying crew, and here again Superintendent Frazier is leading the hosts, for the material is on hand for this work; so Mr. Frazier, who has come on from Salt Lake City to direct the track laying, and to take the position of roadmaster when the line is completed, is in operation. The cause of the little delay at this point is the failure of the Southern Pacific to put in the connection. As it is proposed to follow up the track laying with a construction train, and deliver all material possible at the point where it will be used, this connection must be placed first. The roadmaster of the Southern Pacific has promised that he will make this connection Monday, so that not later than the middle of next week the construction crew and train will start out on the tangent to Rock Wells, and should make short work of that portion of the first, or Mason, lap of the road.

It is the intention of the officials to crowd the track-laying crew with all possible dispatch, as an effort is being made to get a train service effective not later than December 1st, at which time the fall movement of the vast tonnage of valley products will be well under way.

At the rate the work is now advanced the grading contracts should be completed before the advent of the heavy winter weather, a few weeks delay will mean many provoking and harassing spells of idleness on account of shaly weather, and it is the earnest intention of all concerned to avoid this.

In about ten days a delegation of officials and managers of the Nevada Copper Belt will visit the scene of operations, at which time many of the minor details of the undertaking will be finally decided upon.

IMLAY PROPERTY SHOWS REAL STUFF

Local Interests Receive News of Most Encouraging Nature.

FIRST CAR OF CONCENTRATES EN ROUTE

Mill Will Be Operated at Capacity When More Water Is Available.

Superintendent John R. Turner of the Imlay mine at Humboldt, Nevada, sends most encouraging reports to local interests as to conditions at that mine. On the No. 1 level he has fourteen feet of milling ore running twenty ounces of silver and six dollars in gold to the ton. This ore is being broken in development work and run through the mill. On the No. 2 level the ore is increasing in value as the work progresses south and nears the point under the big ore body on the No. 1, through which Turner has drifted for 160 feet. On the No. 1 level the ore increases in value as the drift progresses and pockets of high-grade gold are being found. One pocket last week produced fifty pounds of ore which assayed nearly \$10,000 per ton.

The mill is working perfectly, the only drawback being lack of water, which prevents the plant from being run over ten hours per day. It has been an exceedingly dry season in Nevada and springs this year have gone dry that have never been known to fail before. As soon as the fall rains set in the mill will be worked to its full capacity. The directors declare that they have ample ore in sight to run the mill twenty-four hours per day for an indefinite period.

The company has its first car of concentrates en route and the first clean-up will be made October 10. President Morgan of this city, in receipt of the bullion that has been produced since September first.

The injunction or restraining order was issued upon petition and complaint of the National Mining company of Nevada, owner of the West Virginia mining claim, upon which the Combination, or Stall brothers, lease is located. The plaintiff alleges that the Stall brothers are in unlawful possession of the lease and by reason thereof it has been damaged to the extent of \$50,000.

UNCLE SAM MANAGER IS VERY OPTIMISTIC

Believes That Market Prices Are Much Too Low, But Will Recover.

Imlay-National and Other Properties Are Opening Up Big.

C. C. Griggs, manager of the Uncle Sam at Tintic, was in this city yesterday in consultation with local officers regarding company business. Mr. Griggs stated that though there was nothing particularly new to report from the property, it continued in good shape and that operations were moving along very satisfactorily. Mr. Griggs is of the opinion that the bottom has been reached in the prices of stocks represented in his district, and he believes that ere long conditions will change and that stocks will be in demand. He states that the mines of all the companies in Tintic whose stocks have been discouragingly low for some months past, are in as good and better shape than ever, and he believes the prevailing prices, considering the worth of the properties concerned, to be ridiculously low.

Mr. Griggs is very well pleased with the record-breaking production of the Uncle Sam, attained last month, which twenty-eight cars of ore were shipped in twenty-six days, this being a particularly gratifying achievement when it is understood that it is necessary to haul the product a long distance from the mine to the shipping point. Mr. Griggs feels much encouraged over the outlook for the Tintic district in general and the Uncle Sam in particular.

THE HUMBOLDT MINES

That the Humboldt, Nevada, district is destined to become one of vast mineral production and wealth, is the opinion of Josiah Copley, who has just returned from an extended stay in that section. Mr. Copley states that increased activity is noticeable at the present time in all properties of the district, and he says that in every instance development work is opening up great possibilities for the future.

Mr. Copley recently visited the Imlay, from whence most gratifying news has just reached this city, and found conditions there just as satisfactory as have been reported to the local interests of the company. The mill, he states, is running splendidly, the lack of water being the only drawback to its operations.

The National company lease, Mr. Copley says, is producing some wonderfully rich ore, which is being assayed and placed in bank vaults for keeping until a shipment can be made. He believes that reports of the richness of the National have in no way been exaggerated.

At Mr. Copley's own properties in the north end of the district, the Jugal and Jackson Mountain claims, he states that some of the richest copper ore ever found has been uncovered by him, the product being about half actual metal, copper and lead, besides some gold and silver values. He says that he has opened up a body of very rich ore which is sixty feet wide, and has depth also of over sixty feet. Mr. Copley says that in the part of the country in which he is operating, the snows come in early fall, and he has suspended operations now until next May or June.

FAMOUS OLD MINING SUIT IS SETTLED

Discoverers of Great Portland Mine Finally Adjust Their Differences.

The famous million dollar Doyle Burns mining suit which has been in the courts of this state for several years, has been settled, and this afternoon, in the district court at Glenwood, Mills county, where the case was to have come up again next week, a stipulation was filed, signed by attorneys from Council Bluffs and Denver, representing the litigants. Each side is to pay the costs in the case, which amount to many thousands of dollars. The terms of the settlement are not divulged in the stipulation, and cannot be learned. This case has three times been tried.

The Doyle-Burns suit is one of the most noted in the history of mining litigation. Doyle and Burns were the discoverers of the great Portland mine at Cripple Creek. After disposing of the property to a stock company, suit was filed in Colorado by Doyle against Burns asking a million dollars as his share of the transaction. Burns secured an injunction prohibiting Doyle from bringing action in Colorado courts, which injunction was ignored by Doyle, who spent some months in prison for contempt of court. After his release, Doyle took the case to the Iowa courts and was given a judgment for \$650,000. Burns appealed the case and secured a new trial. He was given a verdict in his favor, upon which Doyle appealed the case again, and it was the retrial, secured by Doyle, which was to have been heard, when the suit was settled.

IOWA COPPER MAY SINK DEEP SHAFT

Shipments From Mine Continue and Ore Bodies Prove Up Big.

Reports from Park City are to the effect that the Iowa Copper property, which started shipping about a month ago, has not only maintained its output since that time, but has materially increased, additional teams having been employed to haul the product from the mine to the smelters. The company, it is said, is realizing from \$18 to \$20 per ton profit on the ore it is shipping, and the mine is now being worked at the present time, for its own development.

It is understood that plans are now being worked upon for the sinking of an operating shaft on the property, with a view to making possible the handling of a much greater tonnage of ore. This ore body from which shipments are being made has opened up stronger and better as mining in it has progressed, and the management is of the opinion that with a shaft to work through, work would not only be simplified, but the deposits would prove up of still greater magnitude.
