Taking Notice.
The string of towns from Nephi to Lehi is sitting up and taking notice and plans are being made for the immediate issuance of booklets dealing with their individual attractions. These booklets will be distributed broadcast throughout the land with the result that these sections, that have been producers for half a century, will receive the benefit of new population and an increase in all agricultural development.
The situation was never so bright as at the present for both the valleys and the sage brush plains.

GENERAL OFFICE FORCES ARE BEING INCREASED
What it means to have general offices for railroads and allied lines, as well as other public utility corporations, established in a city has been fully shown this week, when newcomers for the American Express have been house-hunting and they demand good accommodations to arrive from the Western Pacific. Houses that are good are taken at once and there is a reported scarcity of suitable dwellings. The Oregon Short Line has the largest general office force, and it will be remembered that when it opened its offices in 1887 most of the officials and clerks came here from Omaha, and for that year there was a great scarcity of residences. There are now in Salt Lake the general offices of four large transcontinental railroads, two telegraph companies, two telephone exchanges and three transcontinental express companies, to say nothing of gas, electric and other companies. They bring to the city a fine class of men and they demand good accommodations, so it can be readily seen that the new forces of the Western Pacific will mean something to the city at large.

NEW GOULD STATION BEING QUICKLY FINISHED
The beginning of the end is seen at the new Gould station, where the finishers among plasterers and carpenters are putting in their full time completing the handsome structure. The scaffolding has been removed from the rotunda. The idea can be gleaned of the beauty of this lofty waiting room as well as the decorations. The marble and iron work, as well as the massive quarter-sawn oak balustrades, are being put in place, and by May is the building will begin to show evidence of entire completion. The various offices and separate rooms downstairs are being also finished, and on the outside the tracks and concrete walks are receiving much attention.
Visitors cannot yet enter the interior, but owing to the demand for admittance the officials will be required to keep open for inspection prior to its full occupancy, so that the Salt Lake public can fully appreciate the beauty of their latest terminal.

Price Active Freight Point.
The importance of Price as a freight-handling station on the Denver & Rio Grande had increased five-fold within the last year, according to Robert McKune, a commission merchant of that town, who is in Salt Lake on business. Mr. McKune says there are now 100,000 pounds of freight stored at Price, waiting to be taken by wagon to Vernal and other points in the reservation country. "The railroad has stores that doubled its force at the Price station, and the relief from the former congested condition of the Price freight house is most welcome to the business interests of the town," said Mr. McKune yesterday.
In former years, Price was the shipping point for nearly all the reservation country to the north, but for the last few years, since the mail has been routed by way of and through Dragon, freight has been diverted that way. Now, however, the stage line from Price to Vernal is to be resumed, and the Price gateway to the reservation country is handling more merchandise than ever before.

Special Master Williams Coming.
Word was received Friday that Joseph R. Leitch, clerk of the United States court, that Sylvester J. Williams, special examiner appointed to take the testimony in the case of the government against the Harriman merger of railroads, to the effect that he would be in Salt Lake in a few days. A trial was recently held at Ogden Friday, when the Rio Grande delivered 200 crows to the Harriman lines for movement west.
About 200 hotel men arrive on the Rio Grande Saturday morning.
