


ANNUAL CONCERT BY HIGH SCHOOL BAND

The supreme court handed down an opinion Friday affirming the judgment of the lower court in the case of S. E. and Gideon M. Evans, administrators of the estate of Jesse J. Price, deceased, against the Oregon Short Line Railroad.

In the district court of Cache county a verdict was rendered in favor of plaintiffs in the sum of \$15,500 as damages for the death of Price, who was killed at Richmond, Cache county, September 12, 1907.

The supreme court finds no reversible error on the part of the lower court, hence the judgment is affirmed. Justice Frick wrote the opinion of the court, which is concurred in by Chief Justice Straup and Justice McCarty.
