

MORE ACTIVITY IN WALL STREET

Even the Stocks Not Regularly Traded in Show Some Signs of Life.

GENERAL OUTLOOK GOOD FOR A BETTER MARKET

Banks Are Still Conservative in Regard to Making Large Disbursements.

NEW YORK, Aug. 16.—Trading today in the stock market was more active and embraced many specialties, such as Colorado Southern, American Beet Sugar, National Biscuit, American Ice, Central Leather and International Harvester. The movement in these stocks was almost wholly manipulative. Later in the day the more active issues, including Reading, Union Pacific, Southern Pacific, Atchafalaya, St. Paul, United States Steel, Amalgamated Copper and American Smelting, showed advances. Sentiment was more cheerful on the whole, traders being the great many of the western and southern banks still show heavy loan expansions on real estate.
