

Friday: Temperature at 6 p. m., 73 degrees; maximum temperature, 75 degrees; minimum temperature, 56 degrees; mean temperature, 66 degrees, which is 4 degrees below normal; total deficiency since the 1st of the month, 1 degree; total excess since January 1, 511 degrees.

Precipitation at 6 p. m., none; total precipitation since the 1st of the month, none, which is .06 inch below normal; total deficiency since January 1, 5.37 inches.

The sun rises September 3 at 5:57 a. m. and sets at 6:58 p. m.

Condensed Telegrams

NEW YORK, Sept. 2.—The Standard Oil company today announced a reduction of 15 cents in all grades of refined petroleum.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 2.—The comptroller of the currency today called on national banks for a statement of their condition at the close of business September 1.

NEW YORK, Sept. 2.—The Rt. Hon. Lord Cowdray, who, as Sir Westman Peterson, headed the list of those elevated to the peerage on the ascension of King George to the throne of England, is here today from England to wage war for oil business in Mexico.

BATH, Me., Sept. 2.—An average for four knots of 22.5 knots an hour was made today by the torpedoed destroyer Paulding on her official acceptance trial. This exceeds the showing of her sister ships, the Buzzard and Reids, a year ago. All three are Bath built.

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 2.—Professor Frederick Augustus Gault, Jr., formerly of the department of chemistry at the University of Pennsylvania, and a widely-known poison expert, died at home in Lansdowne, near here, late last night of Bright's disease, aged 55 years.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 2.—The crop reporting board of the department of agriculture estimates that the average conditions of the cotton crop on August 25 was 72.1 per cent of a normal, as compared with 75.5 on July 25, 1909; 83.7 on August 25, 1909; 76.1 on August 25, 1908, and 73.1 the average of the past ten years, on August 25.

MONTREAL, Sept. 2.—Frank O. Fowler, secretary of the Northwest Grain Dealers' association, reported today to the Canadian Pacific Railroad company that this year's northwest grain crop would be 195,519,329 bushels. This indicates an average yield of 12.5 bushels per acre under cultivation, and is 6,000-000 bushels more than shown by any previous reliable estimate.

GOODS IN JAPAN COST MANY LIVES

Tails of the Recent Disaster

TOKIO, B. C., Sept. 2.—The loss of the Japanese goods exceeded according to advices brought by steamer Antiochus, which arrived here today, the loss of the goods of the drowned or missing to total more than 180,000 houses were wrecked, 35,000 being swept away. More than 50,000 acres of land flooded and 200,000 persons are in need of relief. Among the victims was the family of Mr. Kondo.
