

Presidential Proclamation Changes Area
of Kaibab National Forest, Arizona

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6.—The president has signed a proclamation adding approximately 18,330 acres to the Kaibab national forest, Arizona, and at the same time eliminating 10,880 acres. These

changes are the result of a careful field examination made last summer by the United States department of the interior in pursuance of a general plan for the correction of all national forest boundaries.
