Bill Passed.
 After the adoption of the Doremus amendment providing that American vessels engaged in the coastwise trade of the United States shall have free use of the canal, the house finally passed today the Panama canal bill.

Bill on Naval Bill.
 Following the passage of the canal bill, a naval appropriation bill carrying approximately \$15,000,000, was then called for debate upon the measure.

Solicitor McCabe today demanded that he be given an opportunity to appear before the house committee on expenditures in the department of agriculture to answer the sensational charges contained in the Nelson resolution, asking an investigation of the meat inspection service. The committee, it is understood, will not order a general investigation, believing that Mr. Nelson has not made out a prima facie case against the meat inspection service.




