

# BULLFROG IS TO BE GIVEN A CHANCE

## Famous Old District Will Be Opened for the Second Time.

### MONEY IS MADE READY

#### Sunset Company Offers to Take Over Stocks of Old Companies.

GOLDFIELD, Nev., Jan. 26.—An indication of the interest that is being manifested in the possible rehabilitation of the Bullfrog district and the resumption of mining operations in that old-time district is that section is afforded by the fact that an operating fund of approximately \$100,000 will be made available for the Sunset Mining & Development Company from assessments received from the exchange of shares of the three companies that have absorbed for the new corporation.

#### Mining Campaign.

Mining operations on an extensive scale are to be started at once on the Bullfrog property, near Rhyolite, in the Bullfrog district, and it is planned to erect a mill with a capacity from 2000 to 10,000 tons monthly, according as the ore bodies now exposed are further developed at depth. An extensive sampling of the Bullfrog property has been conducted during the past few months, under the direction of a competent mining engineer, and the results show 16,600 tons of ore on the surface and 32,000 tons averaging \$3.77 per ton in five ore shoots that have been developed.

#### Depth to Be Gained.

The first work to be undertaken will be the driving of the main tunnel, now in 1800 feet, to an additional distance of 1200 feet to connect with the workings of the Denver Bullfrog and Rhyolite mines. This will afford 300 feet of depth above the tunnel to the apex of the vein. All of the ore exposed to date has been taken from the upper part of the vein and it is expected that several to get under and explore the lower part of the vein. The tunnel work will be used for hauling and will also handle twelve mine cars at a trip. The Rochester Canyon property is also being developed.

#### ANNUAL OF PIONEER COMPANY IS HELD

A highly prosperous condition, both financially and in point of mine development, is indicated in the annual report of the Pioneer Consolidated Mining Company, which has just been issued. The report shows that the company has a cash reserve of \$1,000,000, with which it will continue the operation and development of its property, and expended more than \$1,000,000 in this character of work during the past year.

# RICHEST FIND YET MADE AT ROCHESTER

## Details of Discovery Are Made Known by the Nenzel Interests.

The richest body of ore yet reported from Rochester was struck yesterday on block 1 of the Rochester Mines company, according to a telegram received by Joseph F. Nenzel from his nephew at Rochester, says the Reno Gazette. The strike is reported by A. E. Mills, mine superintendent of the company.

#### AMERICA IMPORTS A GREAT AMOUNT METAL

Itself the largest producer of some of the world's most needed metals, the annual value of which is fast approaching the billion-dollar mark, the United States naturally exports a considerable quantity, notably of copper, silver, iron and steel. Under ordinary conditions this surplus production would seem to tend to discourage imports of similar products, more especially if those metals included some that must carry a heavy import duty. How large the total import duties are each year can be conjectured when it is known that in the current fiscal year the gross imports of metals and ores amounted to the enormous sum of \$134,180,204. The gross imports of gold in all forms are valued at \$48,936,500, and of silver, \$47,060,210—a total of \$95,996,710.

#### SOME DETAILS GIVEN OF ROCHESTER CAMP

J. L. Safford returned yesterday from Rochester, coming by way of Orlean. Mr. Safford believes the report that the district now contains 1000 men is not exaggerated. Notwithstanding the extremely bad weather which has prevailed almost constantly the past two or three weeks, building is being rushed on many houses in the lower town. Work is being pushed day and night on two or three buildings, so great is the hurry for having them completed. One of these buildings is a hotel of two and a half stories. Although carpenter work is very disagreeable under such weather conditions, the pay is good, being from \$2 to \$3 a day for eight hours, and with the overtime the majority have a chance to get in the carpenters are making more money than almost anywhere.

#### State Was Deserted.

"All these years of continuous operation began to tell on the few well-known and immensely rich deposits, and as the bonanzas of the Comstock mines. As the principal part of the state's mining activity was centered there, with the end of the great bonanzas, a significant noticeable falling off in annual production, Nevada became less inviting, or rather, to the prospectors and the homeseeker as the years rolled by, and thus marked the beginning of the period of depression with which it struggled and heretofore referred to.

#### DENVER OPPOSES THE SYSTEM OF LEASING

Evidences accumulate that the public land states are to pursue more decided action before the courts in their efforts to reverse the policy of the government toward the remaining national domain. At a meeting of the Denver chamber of commerce last week, emphatic resolutions were adopted in opposition to the leasing policy, and this was the first time that the Denver chamber has ever taken such action. The members favoring the resolutions were greatly in the majority, and one of them remarked that the organization ought to have started ten years earlier to arouse the opposition to the mis-styled conservation movement.

Graphic Description Given of Desertion of State Before Recent Revival.

#### Stagnation Period.

"When the great boom of the Comstock Lode had subsided, and prospecting was at a standstill, no railroads being built, those who traversed the breadth of the state, for interstate purposes; no ranches or farms springing into existence; no signs of a new market; with very little taxable property within its borders; its already limited population ever decreasing, Nevada found itself wedged between the point of no return with regard to the matter of longer maintaining its statehood. The struggle lasted probably over a period of twenty years.
