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DISPLAY OF MARBLE IN WALKER BUILDING

Local Company Exhibits Stone Capitol May Be Furnished With.

The Utah Marble & Construction company, the promoters of which hope to furnish marble for the exterior of the new Utah capitol, has just installed a remarkable display of practically all varieties of marble in room 711 of the new Walker Bank building. The company, according to its reports, has an unlimited supply of the beautiful stone, the variety of which is not excelled anywhere in the world.

Professor Frederick J. Paek of the department of geology in the University of Utah, has just completed an investigation of the merits of the deposits of the company. He was enthusiastic over what he had seen and yesterday had the following to say regarding the merits of the Utah marble.

"The company has several quarries, but the one from which it proposes to furnish marble for the capitol is in Beaver county at a point about three-quarters of a mile from the Newhouse branch of the Salt Lake route.
