

### CASE AGAINST THE BISHOP DISMISSED

#### Supreme Court of Washington Reviews Decision in Magnuson Suit.

SEATTLE, Oct. 4.—Directing that Bishop Edward J. O'Dea of Seattle be dismissed as a party to the suit, the state supreme court ordered today a new trial in the damage case of Lizzie Magnuson against the corporation of the Catholic Bishop of Nisqually, the Sisters of the Visitation, a corporation, and several individuals.

The suit grew out of the alleged kidnaping of Mrs. Magnuson's 16-year-old daughter, Marjorie Rihman, and her detention by the Sisters of the Visitation. Mrs. Magnuson was awarded \$23,033 damages by a jury in the superior court.

It was held by the supreme court in its decision today that passion and prejudice were shown in returning a verdict against Bishop O'Dea and that he should not have been made a party to the suit. The court held also that the damages awarded were excessive as Mrs. Magnuson had testified that she expended only \$5000 in effecting the release of her daughter. The mother was the proper custodian of the girl, said the decision, but she was entitled only to compensatory damages.

The alleged kidnaping of Marjorie Rihman led to a series of sensational trials a year or more ago involving attempts in the juvenile courts of Seattle and San Francisco to prove Mrs. Magnuson to be an improper person to have control of the girl. In awarding damages to Mrs. Magnuson, a jury in the superior court here held that she had been persecuted and allowed extra judgments for malicious persecution.

### RAY CONSOLIDATED IS MAKING PROGRESS

Figures Show Large Excess Earnings Over Dividend Requirements at Present Prices.

NEW YORK, Oct. 4.—Ray Consolidated earnings are showing up very satisfactorily, not only because of the better market price of copper but because the company is making steady progress in approaching its rated 87,000 tons a day capacity.

The company showed earnings of nearly \$1,500,000 in the first half of this year, or \$280,000 in excess of present dividend requirements. Earnings in the second quarter were figured on 15 cent metal. Estimating the selling price of copper for the third and fourth quarters at 16 cents a pound, would make Ray Con's earnings for the year well in excess of the \$3,000,000 mark, or about \$80,000 above dividend requirements. If the copper market averages 17 1/2 in the last three months of this year, and the mine shows the expected increase in production, the company will show in round figures \$1,000,000 in excess of a full year's dividend requirements.

### SIX WOMEN REMAIN IN JAIL AT SEATTLE

Free Speech League Will Ask Governor Lister to Pardon Victims of Judicial Wrath.

SEATTLE, Oct. 4.—Thirty-eight persons—six women and thirty-two men—are still in the county jail for refusal to pay the fines imposed upon them for contempt of court by Superior Judge John E. Humphries. One man grew weary of his cell today and paid the \$100 fine assessed against him.

The women in jail are Mrs. Minnie E. Parks, who told Judge Humphries that the "resolutions of defiance" she signed were not half strong enough to express her contempt for him; Mrs. Mary Jarvis, who exclaimed in court that in England judges had less power than in America; Mrs. Ella Price, Mrs. L. Freed, Mrs. Catherine Strilan and Mrs. Hannah Anderson.

At tomorrow night's meeting, called by the Free Speech Defense League, a resolution will be presented asking Governor Lister to pardon the persons convicted by Judge Humphries.

The Seattle Municipal league instructed its committee on county affairs today to investigate the administration of justice in King county courts.

**Religious Tolerance.**

LIMA, Peru, Oct. 4.—Peru in future is to enjoy religious tolerance. Heretofore the exercise of any religion other than the Roman Catholic has been prohibited. The chamber of deputies today adopted by 66 votes an amendment to the constitution, dealing with this subject. The amendment had been already approved by the senate. In spite of the constitutional prohibition the government some time ago permitted the building of a number of Protestant churches and mission schools in various parts of the country.
