

RANK OF AMERICAN GIRL DEMONSTRATED

Princess Radziwill, Former Boston Girl, Scores in Spite of Family Prejudice.

VIENNA, Jan. 10.—The noble relatives of the Princess Radziwill, who was the beautiful Dorothy Deacon of Boston, are now all running after her, in an effort somewhat delayed, to make her acquaintance. She has triumphed over the prejudices of centuries and the influence of the European courts, which are the real powers behind the Almanach de Gotha, to accord her an equal rank with the prince.

Her success is interesting, not only as the result of a three-year struggle, but also in that it may set a precedent for the Duke and Duchess of Croix. The duchess, who was Nancy Leishmann, daughter of the ex-minister, states ambassador to Berlin, is regarded by her new relatives as not of equal birth with her husband; in fact, as inferior.

The Princess Radziwill knew what it was to be put in the Almanach as beneath the rank of her husband, Albert Antoine. For three years she endured this humiliation. Now it is different.

The former Boston girl is officially recognized as the equal of the Polish princess of Radziwill, and the other members of that family, who so strenuously fought the match three years ago, are now working equally hard to find favor with their princess.

This move on the part of the Almanach—the social register of Europe—in placing the American wife on a par with her husband is regarded as a triumph on her part.

GUILTY OF MUTINY ON THE HIGH SEAS

Seven Members of the Crew of the Manga Reva Face Term in Prison.

WILMINGTON, Del., Jan. 10.—Seven members of the crew of the bark Manga Reva, on trial in the United States court here this week on a charge of mutiny, were found guilty by a jury today. A recommendation of mercy was included in the verdict. Sentence will be imposed next Tuesday. The men found guilty are John David Reed, R. D. Williams, Alvin Anderson, Joseph Horsfall, Charles Lyons, John Edlin and William Joyce.

During the trial the government abandoned prosecution against six other members of the crew who had also been indicted for mutiny.

The Manga Reva, under Captain Townsend, sailed from Philadelphia on October 9 for San Francisco, and on November 9 returned to the Delaware breakwater where the captain reported that the crew had mutinied while the bark was 1200 miles out at sea and that he and the first mate had been put in irons. About twenty of the crew were arrested and thirteen were indicted.

At the trial the captain and mate testified that they were seized by members of the crew and held in their cabins for some time and released only on the promise that they would navigate the vessel back to the Delaware Capes.

The accused members of the crew in their testimony charged that the captain and the first mate had been cruel in their treatment and that much of the food given them was unfit to eat and that there was a scarcity of fresh water.

The Manga Reva sailed on November 30 with another captain and crew.
