

RECORD PRODUCTION OF PORTLAND CEMENT Increase of Nearly 10,000,000 Barrels in 1913 Over 1912.

PRICE SLIGHTLY HIGHER Eastern Pennsylvania and Western New Jersey Areas of Heaviest Production.

According to returns received by the United States Geological survey up to January 12, 1914, it is estimated by Ernest F. Burchard that the quantity of Portland cement manufactured in the United States in 1913 was approximately 32,400,000 barrels, compared with 22,438,000 barrels in 1912, an increase of about 9,962,000 barrels, or 44 per cent.

Although few definite statements as to selling prices are available, it is estimated that the average value per barrel was appreciably higher than in 1912. Increases of 10 to 25 cents a barrel are reported from several plants in the central and eastern states, but there were slight decreases reported from a few plants in the Rocky Mountain district.

Two new plants, both in Washington, were added to the list of producers during 1913.

HALIFAX-TONOPAH IS OPENING GOOD ORE

Development work at the Halifax mine continues to open up a large body of good mill ore on both the 1100 and 1000-foot levels, says the Tonopah Belmont.

On the 1100-foot level, the southeasterly raise known as 1103 has now cut the hanging wall of the vein, and proved up a width of seven feet of ore averaging \$14 a ton, and a new east drift has now been started from the south-east drift to the downward extension of this ore body on the main level.

On the main Halifax vein drifting east in progress preparatory to crosscutting north from the shaft, and on the 1400-foot level crosscutting north in progress to cut the downward extension of the vein opened up on the levels above.
