PROSPECTS BRIGHT IN STEEL

There was desultory trading along the list to all orders, but nothing which particularly animated the members at any point. Union Trust stock recorded one sale below 140, and the rights were in good demand around 9, with several calls that could not be filled.

Steel Trade is Encouraging.

Wire products have advanced, but as a rule finished steel shapes are held steady by the conservative leading interests, and the outlook for the future is most encouraging on that account. A heavy tonnage of new business was offered during the past week in contracts for structural steel for various bridges and work by the railways during all of the year, and plate mills fall further behind with deliveries. Rails are selling freely, with notable firmness in weights lighter than standard.

Textile Industries are Active.

Textile industries are active, but the primary market for cotton goods has quieted down after the conclusion of initial purchases. Buyers have received such very liberal offers from the West and South that many of their purchases will be ready for distribution in legitimate trade channels, while many others who operated more conservatively may find difficulty in attending to the wants of their trade. While the woolen goods division is still quiet, the trade in this line shows an increased activity in the West and buyers are complaining of the delay that attends deliveries of dress goods.

Commercial failures this week.

Commercial failures this week in the United States, as reported by Dun & Co., are 236, against 172 last week, 189 the preceding week, and 340 the corresponding week last year. Failures in Canada numbered 24, against 21 the preceding week, and 42 last year.

Bradstreet's Report.

Bradstreet's review will say: Further and serious congestion of railway shipments, more advances in wages, satisfactory reorders, a larger volume of spring trade, greater activity in retail lines, in consonance with colder weather. A marked development of demand for holiday novelties, and persistent requests for railroads and foreign iron and steel, are among the features of an exceptionally busy week.

Shipments of grain probably suffer.

Shipments of grain probably suffer most from the congestion of railroads at a manufacturing plants and shipments of iron and steel mills are also hampered. Industrial plants are being pushed to the utmost, foreign iron is coming in in volume, and the demand for iron and steel of those of railway employes have undergone further favorable changes. Gross railway earnings advanced 11 per cent in October, as compared with October, 1905.
