CHURCH FINANCE DISCUSSED.

Paul E. Slemmon and Waring E. Owen Head Papers.

In the conference on church finance at the Y. M. C. A. last Friday evening, Paul E. Slemmon, secretary of the Mount Pleasant Congregational Society, presented a paper on "Church Finance."

Mr. Waring E. Owen, of Calvary Church, presented the topic "Organization and Duties of Boards of Trustees." He said in substance that the board of trustees should handle the temporal affairs of the church and the board of deacons the spiritual. The minister should not be concerned in any way with the business management of the church; his function is spiritual.

Next week's conference will be on the Sunday school, with Messrs. Briscoe and Millan as speakers.

WHAT SOCIALISTS ASK.

Humanity, Not Wealth, Should Be the Concern of the State.

Editor The Washington Herald: I wish to thank Rev. Stafford for the very great compliment he has paid the cause of Socialism by admitting that within the last fifty years it has grown from ridicule to be "the most important consideration of the day," and not only attracts, but commands the attention of such a strong organization as we all know the Catholic church to be. But that is the history of every great truth that has come to bless mankind; it has had to "force the acceptance of its doctrine on the world whether the world will or not." And it has always had its students trying to "answer" it, as Rev. Stafford proposes to do with Socialism, "as far as may be."

He says he is a Socialist if he is permitted to limit its meaning to "study a desire to benefit mankind and to make the conditions of the working class more tolerable." If he did so limit it, would he be willing to classify himself as a worker?

But why not accept Webster's definition: "A theory of society that advocates a more precise, orderly, and harmonious arrangement of the social relations of mankind than that which has hitherto prevailed?" All Socialists are willing to accept that.

In speaking of the state, Rev. Stafford seems to consider it as something apart and separate from the individual. He says that "in the final mark of what is called modern light the individual is to disappear and the state become omnipotent." And this vague, unknown something which he calls "divine" is to be "the shield of the individual," "the guardians of our liberties," and "the protection of our homes." So long as such ideas are instilled into the minds of men by so-called teachers, so long will the oppressor find it an easy task to make "the condition of the working class" more and more intolerable.

The state is and ever has been a few who have claimed the right to rule, and otherwise to govern, "to rule by command," their fellow-men, and always in their own interests. To-day it is commercialism, and the moneyed interests are being considered above everything else. Even the church is willing to accept "dainted" money, and clamors for more, with the promise of Rev. Stafford to bless whatever makes for the wealth of the state.

Socialists claim that humanity and not wealth should be the concern of the state, and they hold that the whole people should "administer" their own affairs instead of permitting a few rich men to "govern" them. To accomplish this the Socialists propose establishing an Industrial Democracy, in which each individual shall have an equal opportunity, economically, with every other individual to earn his living and develop his best that is in him, instead of our political republic, in which the "life, liberty, and pursuit of happiness" of the many are placed in the hands of the few. The Socialists recognize the fact that wage slavery is a worse curse than chattel slavery ever was, and they are determined that the exploitation of the working class shall cease, whether the exploitation be done by the individual, the church, or the state.
