

RISE OF DAWN HINS

Captures Handicap from a Field of Ten.

BILLIE HIBBS' CUP RACE

After He Made the Best of a Poor Start, Dunlop's Horse Comes Home in Front an Odds-on Favorite.

The Spring Hunter's Steeplechase Proves Easy for Dion Kerr's Essex.

Rose of Dawn, played from 8 to 1 down to 18 to 5, and running in the colors of J. W. Colt, won the Second Benning Spring Handicap yesterday in one of the prettiest finishes of the meeting.

Billie Hibbs, from David Dunlop's stable, an odds-on favorite, took the Jesse Brown Cup, and Dion Kerr's Essex, ridden by Mr. Taylor, and the success of long shots.

The three stake events, with three other overnight races, made up the banner card of the Benning spring meeting, and the crowd was one of the largest that has been in attendance.

It is the opinion of most racegoers, however, that the race was a very open race. Three of the horses carded were scratched, leaving ten to go.

Every one had more or less to say for the favorite, Rose of Dawn, Slickaway, The Clown, Campaigner, and Lord Bonerages were the medium of plumes and it is probable that the race was the best betting affair at the meeting.

There was some delay at the post, but the start was a good one. Tickle showed in front at the start, but she was quickly outrun by Graziallo, Lord Bonerages, and Slickaway.

At the far turn Graziallo had increased his lead to two lengths, with Bonerages running second, and Slickaway third, while Rose of Dawn was well up.

Turning for home Graziallo still led, and was going easily. Straightened out there was a general closing up, and Graziallo, when he heard the field coming behind him, hung out his usual sign of cowardice, and began to back up.

He kept the lead for a few strides and then retired, while Lord Bonerages came along in game manner. A sixteenth from home it looked as if he would win, but Rose of Dawn, who had gradually worked her way into a contending position, closed with a rush and nailed Bonerages a few strides from the wire, winning a good race by a scant length.

Slickaway held third position safe from the head of the stretch home, while Graziallo did manage to finish fourth.

The cup race was an easy victory for Billie Hibbs, after he had got the best of a poor start.

Only three went to the post in the Spring Hunters' Steeplechase. These were Dion Kerr's good reputed half-bred Essex, ridden by Mr. Taylor, of Baltimore; J. W. Colt's Lysistrata, on whom J. O'Brien had the mount, and Guardian, Mr. Levering's jumper, with Mr. Harrison, of Virginia, in the saddle.

No one looked farther than Essex for the win, and 3 to 5 the opening price against him, was eagerly grabbed. Even at 1 to 2 there was a big play on him, while the other two were scarcely supported.

Guardian led for a half mile, but was overtaken by Mr. Taylor's Essex, who drew a fine finish, winning by half a length, when he could have made it ten.

A good betting race was the first, in which Greeno was the favorite, with Washburn Queen, Belle of Jessamine, Water Dog, and Old Colony liked in the order named.

Belle of Jessamine was pacesetter in the big turn, where Greeno moved up strongly on the outside, and at the head of the stretch he looked like winner, but inside the last sixteenth he stopped utterly, and Belle of Jessamine, closing strong, won, with Washburn Queen second and Jack McKeon a head before Greeno.

In the Jesse Brown Cup, Billie Hibbs was always favorite, but Jubilee had a smart play. The others were at good prices. Billie Hibbs got the better of a poor start, and this won for him. He was two lengths in front from the start, and the other two were well up.

Jubilee was easily best of the others, while Trey of Spades was fifth on the card. J. W. Colt scratched Pioneer and Kit Commodore Fontaine for the stable honors. The Commodore was always favorite, and though he put up a good showing for his first start of the season, he had to lower his colors to Dr. Keith, the second choice, whose victory was due to better seasoning. The other two were outclassed.

Blue Buck, favorite in the last, was unplaced, but he was heavily played, winning from Sally K. Madden's filly, by a head. Dekabar ran into third place, while Blue Buck was never a contender.

GOSSIP OF THE TRACK. Hundreds of New Yorkers took their grips to the track with them and left immediately after the races for home on the Cavanaugh Special.

Trey of Spades hung on better than he did in his last race, when he quit to a walk in the stretch. He could not beat the two that finished in front of him, but he easily disposed of the others.

Previous winners of the Second Benning Spring Handicap were Charentus, Moor, Himself, Merriment, Graziallo, Bohemia, and Pater. When Charentus won the first running of the race he defeated the great mare Imp, who finished third, Bradley's Boney Boy finishing second.

Commodore Fontaine's showing in the overnight chase was an excellent one, and it looks as if this horse would make a good one up the line. He had plenty of speed, jumped well, and lost only because of lack of condition. With another race in him, Dr. Keith would have been Fontaine.

Blue Buck was the worst favorite of the meeting. Form players figured Bul-
