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HEART DISEASE INCREASING.

One of the Consequences of Our Hurried Living.

Dr. Beverley Robinson, of New York, the well known authority on heart disease, has much to say in a recent issue of the American Journal of Medical Science not only regarding the increasing prevalence of heart affections, but on the various causes of the malady as applied to our modern methods of living, says the New York Herald.

The heart is a wonderfully constructed dynamic pump, with a working energy of seventy years and more, but it must be treated as any other valuable machine, with due care as to capacity, strength, and endurance. But the opposite is so much the case that it is time to think and act in a reasonable way before it may be brought to a point where it is impossible to do so.

Not only does this important vital organ become organically affected as the result of rheumatism, pneumonia, typhoid fever, diphtheria, grip, and Bright's disease, but in a more indirect way by pure overstrain of function. Under the latter circumstances, the slightest stimulation of the cardiac walls is sufficient to occur and damage the victim to a greater or less extent for life.

"From one day to another," says Dr. Robinson, "some of these patients become comatose, or fall into a state of reason of palpitation and a feeling of weakness and inability to do their usual work. Frequently it has been the result of long-continued mental work of a severe character, to which there has rarely been even a temporary cessation. Again, it has been the immediate result of some great and sudden affliction, or of collapsed business ventures after a short and losing fight to prevent relative poverty and obscurity, or, at times, greatly diminished prestige and honorable repute among one's fellows."

In these cases it is perhaps not so much the weakness of the heart itself as the lack of nervous forces behind the trouble. Obviously, then, the slightest stimulation disturbs more seriously affect the organ. A sudden strain, even of short duration, is frequently very injurious and often fatal. A heart once fairly dilated is often permanently damaged. Like a skittish horse, it is likely to shy on the slightest provocation.

The so-called "acute indigestion" is a notable contributory cause to collapse by a mere disturbance of heart action in an already crippled organ. What would be a well person means simple attack of colic would be death to one with a weak and dilated heart.

Such persons should always be cautious against overexertion, particularly of a physical character. Even severe mental perturbation often turns the scale. Not a few of such cases are on record, proving the slight hold these affections have upon life. And yet the unwary victims are often surprised to find that, after a time, we often hear of the frail, feeble, and hurrying to get a train, or of a poor girl who danced herself into fatal collapse.

There are extreme instances, it is true, but they may, with a little care, be avoided in their way. At the bottom of the whole business is the dreadful hurry habit which has become characteristic of the American method of living.
