Barrett Establishes a Record at Washington Grove.

LOCAL ATHLETES WIN PRIZES

Barrett established a record in the 100-yard dash at Washington Grove, Md., Sept. 2-T. K. Barrett, of the Maryland Swimming Club, of Baltimore, broke the South Atlantic record for the twelve-pound hammer throw at the games of the Washington Grove Athletic Association to-day, with a throw of 139 feet 1 1/2 inches. The former record was 132 feet 5 inches.

The Gurley Athletic Association, of Washington, made a creditable showing, their senior relay team clipping one-fifth of a second off the track record. B. M. Hildebrand, a member of this club, ran a pretty race in the mile, leading all the way, although hard pushed in the stretch by Wenderoth, of George Washington University.

W. G. Thrall, of Technical High School, broke the local record for the pole vault, clearing 10 feet 6 inches. Thrall was heavily handicapped that he got only second place, Owen, of the Washington Grove Athletic Association, winning with a vault of 8 feet. Thrall barely missed at 11 feet, his arm touching the bar hard enough to make it fall after his body had cleared the cross piece.

L. Whiting, of George Washington University, did the best individual work of the afternoon. He got first in the high jump, first in the 100-yard hurdles, and second in the 220-yard dash, although he was disqualified in the last race, on account of a foul.

Williams Wins Three.

C. L. Williams, of Washington, also did well, getting prizes in the three jumping events. He was first in the broad jump, second in the high jump, and third in the pole vault.

Create Hoop Among Reed Birds on First Day of Season.

That the shooting season was opened yesterday was not hard to guess, for hunters were much in evidence in all parts of the city, with their favorite dogs and shotguns.

On the Eastern Branch of the Potomac the lowlands were alive with hunters, and fine reed bird shooting was found there. Other hunting places in the District were also infested with sportsmen, and many casualties to the feathered tribe resulted. At an early hour yesterday morning a mounted policeman was detailed to the marshes with a copy of the code book in his pocket, one section of which permits the shooting of reed birds, octopus, ruff, and marsh blackbirds.

MAJOR TAYLOR RETURNS.

Colored Cyclist Has Great Success on European Tracks.

Worcester, Mass., Sept. 2.—Major Taylor, the crack cyclist, accompanied by his family, has arrived unexpectedly in Worcester from France, where he closed a wonderfully successful racing career. When he went there last spring he was unable to show anything like his old-time lightning form, owing to lack of condition, but he soon struck his winning gait, and won victory after victory over all the crack riders of Europe, with the exception of Jacquelin, who beat him when he first arrived there. Taylor refused later to take on a return race, as Jacquelin had gone off form and been beaten by second and third rate riders.

Taylor defeated Frenon, the English champion; Pouliard, French champion last year; Ellegard, the Danish champion; Van den Bora, the Belgian champion; Verri, the Italian champion, and Frio, the French champion and winner of the Grand Prix.
