GAME IS CALLED OFF

Rain Prevents Washington-Columbus Contest.

PLAY IN LOUISVILLE TO-DAY

After Two Conflicts with the Colonels, Nationals Will Start Tomorrow at Six P. M. for Boston, Where They Will Arrive Tuesday for Opening Game with Pilgrims.

Columbus, Ohio, April 10.—Rain began falling just after the Washington team arrived here this morning at 2 o'clock and continued uninterrupted all day, causing the game with Columbus to be called off. The team leaves here at 2 o'clock in the morning for Louisville, where it will play to-morrow and Sunday, leaving there 6 p. m. Sunday for Boston, where it will arrive on Tuesday morning to play the opening game of the American League season that day.

The Boston American League team came in this afternoon from Dayton, Ohio, where its game was canceled by rain.

Taylor Likes His Team.

President John I. Taylor is with the Pilgrims and is enthusiastic over the outlook for the coming season. He is relying especially upon his pitchers, who have shown fine form in the practice games. His team has won eleven out of thirteen exhibition contests to date, and has been hitting the ball with great timeliness, although not in great bunches. KWAI BEATEN IN SECOND RACE
